SUMMARY

Toronto—Market easier in heavy trading.
New York—Stocks lower; industrials pace decline.
Montreal—Industrials lower in moderate trading.

Currencies
MONTREAL (CP)—The U.S. dollar closed Monday at a discount of 15-32 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 3-32. Pound sterling \$2.67 1/4, unchanged.

Toronto Stocks
TORONTO (CP)—The stock market eased Monday but a light buying rally in the closing minutes lifted prices from their lows. It was the heaviest turnover in six weeks. The final volume of 6,862,000 shares was the heaviest since Jan. 22.

Uranium, shaken by profit-taking for most of the session, were the leaders in the rallying stage. Stanleyth gained 25 cents at \$5.25 while Stanrock, Pardee Amalgamated, Northspan and Lorado added 12-20 cents.

Gold was stronger, led by Hollinger, up \$1 to \$24.50. Coppers and junior base metals eased. Chibougamau Mining and Eastern Mining were 25-cent losers. Several other issues dipped 15 cents. Canadian Atlantic was largely responsible for the index loss among western oils. It lost 40 cents at \$5.20. Canada Southern cents at \$7.25. Security gained 20 cents at \$4 and National Petroleum added 15 cents at \$4.85.
