Dal. Specialists In Psychiatry Include Islander

HALIFAX (CP)—Dr. John Williams of St. John's, Nfld., and Dr. Malcolm N. Beck of Charlottetown have received certificates as specialists in the field of psychiatry from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. President A. E. Kerr of Dalhousie University announced Friday.

The men recently completed a four-year course in psychiatry at the university. Dr. Williams received his degree in medicine from Dalhousie in 1950 and studied psychiatry at Dalhousie from 1954 to 1956. He finished his training at the Newfoundland Hospital for Nervous and Mental Diseases. Dr. Beck graduated in medicine from McGill, studied psychiatry at Dalhousie for two years, spent a year in child psychiatry at Richmond, Va., and completed his training at Falconwood Hospital in Charlottetown.

By FRASER WIGHTON LONDON (Reuters) — Prime Minister Eden left London for his country home at Chequers Friday amid rumors he will shake up his cabinet—possibly before Parliament reassembles at the end of January.

isolation for a land rehabilitation program already is being drafted. The legislation reportedly would extend benefits of Prairie Farm Rehabilitation to all parts of the country. It would also provide a plan for sharing with the provinces costs of approved projects for soil conservation and irrigation, reclamation of land for farm use, and resettlement of farmers operating sub-marginal land. Experts estimate about one-quarter of the approximately 400,000 farms in Eastern Canada are sub-marginal, yielding less than \$1,200 worth of products for commercial use a year. The government's request for the senate inquiry likely will be made soon after the session opens, through Solicitor-General Macdonald, government leader in the Senate.
