FILIPINOS TO FIGHT ON.

Were Never More Determined.

HONG KONG, Nov. 13.—Private and trustworthy advices from Manila report much indignation amongst all classes of Filipinos, owing to the publication of a statement to the effect that Omaha despatches allege that Filipino officers have held a conference showing an inclination to accept an amnesty and to cease hostilities, but that this had been prevented owing to Mr. Bryan's promise that if he were elected to the presidency of the United States the Filipinos should have their independence declared. This statement is absolutely false. No such conference has been held, nor is any such conference likely to be held. The Filipinos attribute the statements as coming from President McKinley's supporters, possibly Consul Wildman, who has just returned from Manila. The Filipinos were never more determined than now to fight to the bitter end for independence, owing to the brutality of the United States soldiery and the abuses and misgovernment of the Philippine Islands under American rule.

Russia and Manchuria.

LONDON, Nov. 12.—Dr. Morrison, wiring to the Times from Peking, Saturday, says:

"Li Hung Chang has not yet replied to Admiral Alexieff's invitation to resume the government of Manchuria under Russian protection. Russia will require the names of all officials to be submitted to her for approval. Her proposals are tantamount to military occupation; and every Chinaman realizes that Manchuria is lost to China.

"Increasing alarm is felt here at the spread of the insurrection in the southern provinces. No surprise would be caused if Japan intervenes. The trade and financial outlook is very gloomy.

A New Boer Republic.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—A curious story has come from St. Petersburg to the effect that when President Kruger removed his capital to Machadodorp a number of the burghers who had been left in the lurch went north, and decided to start their own Republic at Zoutpansberg. They held the necessary meetings, declared Barend Verster President, Munnik, the ex-landdrost of Boksburg, Vice-President, and a lawyer named Krause, a brother of the commandant of Johannesburg, State Secretary. The exploits of the Zoutpansberg Republic are still unknown.

Lansdowne Praises War Office Work.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—The Marquis of Lansdowne, formerly Secretary of War, and now Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has written a letter of farewell to the officials of the War Office, in which he thanks them for their services, and says that the work they performed showed rare and unstinted devotion to duty. He says this work was attended with the greatest success, and that they are entitled to the highest credit.

Now Quebec.

QUEBEC, Nov. 13.—Rumors were in circulation Saturday that Premier Parent would bring on the provincial election shortly, but from information obtained from the most reliable sources these rumors appear to be rather premature, as it is stated that the Government has not yet taken the matter into consideration. A meeting of the executive committee will be held here tonight, at which the date of the elections may be decided upon.

The Outcome in China.

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—The opening of the interior of China to modern civilization is regarded at Washington, says Journal of Commerce special, as the probable outcome of the present negotiations between China and the powers.

An Arnold Dead.

LONDON, Nov. 13.—Thomas Arnold, fellow and examiner in English language and literature at the Royal University of Ireland, second son of the celebrated Thomas Arnold, head master of Rugby and father of Mrs. Humphrey Ward, the novelist, died yesterday. He was born November 30th, 1823.
