

CURRENT NOTES.

An actress was offered a sealskin cloak if she would speak for an hour. At the end of seven minutes she exclaimed: "Mind it got to be a \$250 one."

"You have been up here before me half a dozen times this year," said an Austin justice, severely, to a local vagrant. "Come, now, Judge, none of that. Every time I've been here I've seen you here. You are here more than I am. People who live in glass houses should not throw stones."

Parliamentary returns report the depreciation in value of the crops in Ireland for the year 1882 in consequence of unfavorable harvest, aggregated £5,118,167 as compared with £2,537,664 as compared with the average of the preceding ten years. The bulk of the loss was £5,317,687 as compared with the year 1881 and £2,274,431 as compared with the average for the preceding ten years.

The local option law of Maryland has a provision requiring a physician to write in ink all his prescriptions for liquor, and to record them fully for the inspection of the State Attorney. Total abstinence people have begun to enforce this, and a doctor is under six indictments in a test case. He had given prescriptions to all of his friends who asked for them.

The Australian colonies are at desperate pains to prove that \$480,000,000 is not a cent too much for 2,000,000 persons to owe, and the Agent-General for New Zealand lately read a paper before the Colonial Society in London with this view. He was backed up by Mr. J. Pope Hennessy, and the Duke of Manchester was in the chair, but neither of these personages weigh much with the British investor.

A California capitalist hypothecated a large block of mining stock for a loan; the stock immediately began to rise, and the person to whom it was pledged sold it. When the price fell he bought it back, clearing \$205,000 by the transaction. As soon as the real owner heard of the speculation he sued for the entire profits as belonging to him, and the Supreme Court has decided in his favor, and ordered the sum to be paid to him.

A great snow-storm in San Francisco was, of course, the cause of innumerable incidents of a ludicrous nature. It is estimated that 100,000 persons threw snow during the day. In some of the liveliest quarters of the town horse-holders packed snow inside, and from the windows resided the assaults of besiegers in the streets. The snow was hailed with delight by everybody, especially by the small boys, and with terror by the Chinese. John's snowballs everywhere invited a fusillade of snowballs. Everybody engaged in the sport. Absolute strangers meeting would "fire" at each other, and have it out for two or three minutes with evident relish. The order of the day was: "When you see a head or anything, hit it!" The scene was lively and ludicrous. The gray-headed pioneer, who had not seen a snow storm for years, actually cried with delight. He "shied" snowballs at other pioneers. The general street scenes reminded old-timers of the demonstration of the populace on the arrival in that city of the first overland stage on the southern route, when people went mad, and threw their hats first in the air, and next under the wheels of the stage-coach. Nobody escaped. Umbrellas proved ineffectual barricades against the flight of missiles from several quarters at once. The sport on the street was frequently ill-mannered, but not generally ill-natured. The police did not escape. It is reported that one policeman south of Market street had to "move on" three blocks to escape.

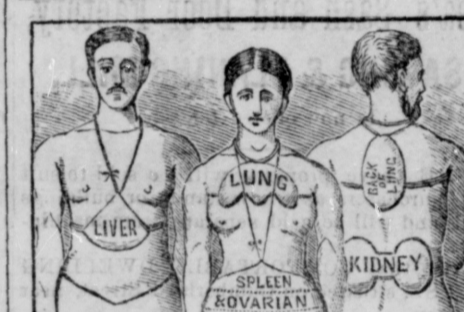
