THE BRAVEST DEED I EVER SAW.

Archibald Forbes relates a Thrilling Incident of the Zulu War.

Archibald Forbes has seen so many brave deeds that it was with some natural curiosity that we turned to his paper in Pearson's Magazine under this title. The deed which he selects as the bravest that he ever saw was the rescue of a wounded trooper, which won for Lord Charles Berosford the Victoria Cross. He thus tells the story—

"Colonel (now General) Sir Redvers Buller had been ordered to make a reconnaissance before Cetewayo's Kraal of (Ulundi). Berosford led the advance, Buller following with the main body. Berosford, on his smart chestnut, with the white ticks on withers and flanks, was the foremost rider of the force. The Zulu chief lunging up the rocky and uneven fastnesses suddenly turned on the lone horseman who had so outridden his followers. A big man, even for a Zulu, the ring round his hand proved him to be a warrior. The muscles rippled on his shoulders as he compacted himself behind his cowhide shield, marking his distance for the thrust of the gleaming assegai.

A Coyote Trick.

H. H. Sappington was in the city Friday and brought up several coyotes to be punished by the country clerk, says the Bozeman Chronicle. We are here reminded that Mr. Sappington relates an incident to which he was an eye-witness, that proves the coyote to be a sharp-witted beast. He was out in the hills near his ranch, when he noticed a coyote chasing a jack rabbit at the top of his speed. Away they went, the rabbit gradually curving his course and finally coming back to the starting point.

Now suddenly a second coyote springing out of hiding and took his turn at swinging around the circle, the third coyote stepped in and kept his pouncing up until they were out the poor jack Mr. Sappington was of the opinion that the coyote, in order to secure a dinner of jack rabbit, had entered into an arrangement with a brother coyote to join him in the hunt. For no wolf can singly run down a jack rabbit at the top of his speed. A second coyote would catch it, but the rabbit never always runs in a wide circle, because it is its nature to return to its native slope of pasture.

Flesh of Sheep. That the flesh of sheep fed by the sea is superior to that of those fed inland may be attributed to the fact that the most suitable feeding grounds are to be found in the proximity of the coast. Sheep delight in the short grass and peculiar fragrance of hill pastures and bare fields; and the mutton produced in such pastures, and by the breeds most suitable to them, is of superior quality to that of the large, fat sheep on richer soil. The multitude of tiny shells so often found on every foot of turf is also very efficacious in fattening and nourishing the animal. Aromatic and bitter herbs are particularly relished by sheep, while the salt deposited on the herbage by the sea winds is a valuable addition to their diet. The finest mutton to be obtained in France is procured from sheep fed on the salt marshes of Normandy, while the flesh of the Shetland and Orkney sheep, which feed largely on seaweed, is delicious. In this country the best tasting mutton is that raised on the associated salt wetlands.
