In the speech from the throne the Governor stated that the members of the Legislature had been summoned so early in order to consult as to the best means of mitigating and alleviating the public calamity which had fallen on the colony.

The Central News correspondent in Antung telegraphs: "In accordance with General Nodden's instructions, Fong Huang garrison was confronted on December 18th by 4,000 Chinese, who began an attack at daylight on the 18th. The garrison was 1,400 strong and commanded by Colonel Tomoyasu. The main battle took place at Yin Min Shan, five miles from Fong Huang. The Japanese attacked with spirit and defeated the Chinese, driving them to Timatch. The Japanese loss was three officers killed and seventy wounded and wounded.
