**QUIZ**

You are South, neither side vulnerable. The bidding has been:

North	East	South	West
1♠	Pass	1♠	Pass
2♠	Pass	2♠	Pass

What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠KQ88 ♥AJ5 ♦J94 ♣K76  
2. ♠J9765 ♥86 ♦Q72 ♣QJ4  
3. ♠AJ752 ♥KQ84 ♦9 ♣A63  
4. ♠K9862 ♥5 ♦QJ74 ♣KJ5

1. Three notrump. At the point partner opened the bidding with a diamond we already knew this was a game-going hand. We had the values and the distribution to jump directly to two notrump, but chose instead to first mention the spade suit in case the best game contract might turn out to be spades.

If we were to bid only two notrump over two hearts, North would have no way of knowing that our hand constituted an opening bid by itself. A two notrump bid would be proper if, for example, the ace of hearts were a low heart. The way to identify the surplus ace is to skip one level and jump to three notrump.

2. Three diamonds. Before discussing this bid it might be best to first decide what kind of hand North has shown by his two bids to date. Since he opened with a diamond and followed our spade response with two hearts, thus bidding his suits in reverse order,

**Pituitary Hormone Adds 3 Inches To Dwarfed Child**

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — A dwarfed 11-year-old girl has grown more than three inches in six months under treatment with human pituitary growth hormone, a University of California scientist reported Saturday.

This is the largest growth rate achieved from pituitary hormone treatment so far, although pituitary growth preparations also have been used successfully in Boston, New York and Canadian research centres.

The case of the dwarfed girl was reported in a paper before a conference on chemical organization of cells by Dr. C. H. Li, who first isolated the animal and human growth hormones. Dr. Li is director of the university's hormone research laboratory.

Eight months ago the girl was taken to hospital and put under the care of Dr. Roberto Escamilla, gland specialist, and Dr. John J. Hutchings and Dr. William C. Deamer, pediatricians. She was no more developed physically than a normal child of 5½. Her trouble was diagnosed as dwarfism due to an infection at six months which damaged her pituitary gland.

**NFARED NORMAL HEIGHT**

Under large doses of extremely precious hormone substance the girl shot up from 44½ inches to a height of 47½ inches. The normal height for her age is 58 inches and the normal growth rate before adolescence is about two inches a year.

The hormone substance is extremely scarce because it has to come from human pituitary glands at autopsy. Dr. Li had only enough to treat one patient. This girl was selected as the case likely to yield the most information about the workings of the substance.

**Nfld. Premier Calls Bridge Petition Improper And Fake**

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Premier Smallwood Wednesday denounced as a fake a petition read in the Newfoundland legislature by Opposition Leader Hollett. The petition asked for a bridge across Placentia Gut.

The Gut is a narrow finger of water off Placentia Bay which separates the town of Placentia from Jerseyside, Freshwater and the United States naval base at Argentia on the south coast. The petition bears 2,592 signatures.

Mr. Hollett said the premier promised during the 1949 election campaign to build a bridge across the 200-foot gut. It would save residents a 24-mile drive.

The premier said that before he made the promise he was assured by a government expert it would cost \$250,000 to build a bridge.

After the election the "top bridge builder" in Canada estimated it would cost well over \$1,000,000. The engineer was identified only as Mr. Thompson.

Mr. Smallwood then went to the people concerned and asked them to release him from the promise in return for an "excellent" ferry system. They agreed, he said.

Ferry docks cost \$365,000. The discussion grew hot and loud when Mr. Smallwood said it was a "fake" petition—the fakery is on the very face of it.

"It is improper and shouldn't have been brought into the house. Many of the names are fake..."

**Liberal Senator Is Opposed To New CBC Bill**

OTTAWA (CP) — Liberal Senator David Croll Wednesday opposed the federal government's new broadcasting legislation on grounds that it will weaken the concept of public ownership in this field and open the way for American domination of Canadian television.

The Toronto senator spoke after the Senate gave preliminary first reading to the broadcasting legislation approved Tuesday by the Commons. It sets up a board of governors to regulate Canadian broadcasting—a function now performed by the CBC board of governors—and provides for the continuance of the publicly-owned CBC under a managerial setup.

Senator Croll said Canadians often express concern over the course taken by U.S. industry in substituting itself for native Canadian industry in this country.

"If we are not careful under this bill the airwaves can go the very same way and it may not be long before we have American domination over our Canadian television," he said.

Canadian TV must remain the property of the Canadian people, to be developed and controlled by the people. It should not be handled like TV in the U.S. where it is "being developed and controlled by the promoters of breakfast foods, soap, cigarettes, cosmetics and what have you."
