### MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) — Prices were generally firm at the close of active trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Monday. Comparatively few changes were as much as 1/2.

Quebec Natural Gas recovered from a 1/8-point drop on Friday, gaining one at 23 1/2.

In otherwise steady groups, CP gained 3/4 at 27 1/2 and Asbestos at 31 1/2 up 1/2. Standing alone and in 10-point losses in groups which also showed no trends were Abitibi at 29, National Steel Car at 21 and Banque Canadienne Nationale at 43.

Several large gains appeared in a stronger miscellaneous category. Canada and Dominion Sugar was up one point at 25, and Abitica at 56 was up 8.

Western oils and producing mines were up.

In slightly weaker penny issues, gains ranged to 5 cents. Losses were generally in a 10-cent range but Akalick dropped 20 cents to 45, Coniagas went down 27 cents to 65 and Colting at 61 cents was down 14.

The closing averages show banks off .09 at 50.21, utilities off .4 at 142.6, industrials up .4 at 263, combined up .1a to new high of 222.2, papers up .3 at 375.7 and goods up 1.53 at a new high of 74.47.

## CUTAIL LEAD Output at Trail

MONTREAL (CP) — Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company Sunday announced plans to curtail lead production at its refinery in Trail, B.C., by 20 per cent this year because of depressed markets.

About two weeks ago the company reduced its lead price by a half-cent to a post-war low of 10 1/2 cents following a similar cut to 11 cents by leading producers in the United States.

The announcement said the Trail refinery will be shut down for three weeks in July and August and operation for the remainder of the year will be at a reduced scale.
