DON'T WHIP YOUR CHILDREN.
Some Remarks on the Subject Brought
Out by a Recent Attempted
Suicide.
A boy in this city tried to kill himself
with a revolver because his father had
promised him a whipping for going out
to play when he had been bidden to
stay at home and mind the other chil-
dren.
The incident may possibly convey a
lesson or even a bunch of lessons, to
many other families and to various
classes of families.
To this particular home the Evening
Telegram, always on guard against
seeming interference with family
discipline and family rights, would prefer
to let the matter itself speak. It would
be foreign to this newspaper's purpose
or functions to pronounce specifically
upon the merits of this case. It would
prefer to assume that this parent acted
normally and in accordance with his
rights and with the accepted principles
of justice and humanity.
Let it be granted, then, that this
lad deserved punishment and that the
punishment from which he shrink
so dreadfully was not inordinately se-
vere. In that case, is not this occur-
rence in a degree an arraignment of
the accepted principles of justice and
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ment?
Here was a child in modest, and
not over-refined life, as it happened, to
give the greater emphasis to the lesson
taught in this case, and who, in order
to brains to taking a whipping from the
hands of his father. After pleading
pitifully for the remission of the pen-
alty which theoretically he had amply
earned, he went and made an attempt
upon his life. Does not this prove
that for children of some organizations,
in all walks of life, corporal punish-
ment is not practicable or fit? Corporal

and private schools.

sonal violence?

some of the problems in the way of
emancipating children from the terrors
of switch and fist, whether by law or
by the evolution of public opinion. If
little Mary neglects to stay in bed to
mind the baby, she might with good
effects be kept in her room. If little
Johnnie does not come in from
play at the prescribed hour or when
called, he might well be withheld for a
period from going out at all. If little
Johnnie's father forgets his table
manners so far as to gobble, or snarl,
or snatch or grumble (table accidents
always barred), he might be logically
deprived of all his meal, or that he
being deemed injurious to health, of
the more appetizing portions of it. So on.
The claim that some children are
so constituted that they cannot be
governed without a whipping—also
from the mot of science that it is
only a result of hereditary, the result-
ant of the parental influences of their
ancestry, and of the character of their
parents favored by the reply that these
children are not well governed even
with whipping.
At any rate, the continual instances,
like the one under consideration, where
children seek death as a relief either
from threatened bodily punishment or
from the sham and soul-searching follow-
ing it, might well admonish society and its
guide, legislative and other, of the
need of reform in this quarter.
Moreover, it ought to be a conclusive
answer to the objections of those who
reform that, if public school teachers
and Sunday school teachers are able
to efficiently govern their pupils and
children in large numbers, not their
own, parents ought to be able to do
as much with their own. Those pa-
rents who cannot ought themselves to
get the whipping—New York Tele-
gram.
