180-Pound Sturgeon Speared Through Ice

NEENAH, Wis., (AP) — A 180-pound sturgeon was speared and hauled through the ice of Lake Winnebago Tuesday by Elroy Schroeder of Appleton, Wis.

The 79-inch giant was 28 pounds heavier than the record 88-inch sturgeon taken from the same waters in 1947.

Wisconsin has a regular season for spearing sturgeon through ice in the Winnebago lake system, since the fish seldom are taken by hook and line.

Middleweight Bout March 27

NEW YORK, (AP) — The International Boxing Club Wednesday signed middleweight contenders Paddy Young and Ernie Durando to meet in a 12-round elimination bout at Madison Square Garden, March 27.

The IBC closed the match after Young's manager received a release from British promoter Jack Solomons. Young has signed to meet Britain's Randy Turpin in London, March 17.

The joint board of the NBA and the New York Athletic Commission had recommended that Young and Durando fight it out for the right to meet Carl Bobo Olson of San Francisco for the American middleweight crown. The winner then was to meet the victor of a European elimination between Turpin and France's Charles Humez.

Abe Green, commissioner of the NBA, said if Olson doesn't fight the winner of the Durando-Young fight "he will be considered out of it altogether."

Olson's manager, Sid Flaherty, claims he has agreed to have Olson fight Turpin in London, June 9.
