

Deficit Of Seven Nations Sparks United Nations Drive

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP) Canada and six other countries Tuesday opened a drive to rescue the United Nations emergency force from the red through a new system of payments.

Seven of the partner-countries in UNEF—which stands between Israel and Egypt in the ever-tense Middle East—joined in co-sponsoring a draft resolution aimed at slashing assessment for UNEF on smaller and medium countries.

Norway introduced the resolution in the 14th general assembly committee after the United States and Britain pledged a total of nearly \$3,500,000 in voluntary contributions for UNEF, which is on an extremely shaky financial ground.

The resolution — by stressing the virtue of voluntary contributions from the wealthier countries—seeks in this way to reduce the financial burden on poorer countries which say that UNEF should not be assessed against them in the same way as the total UN budget.

ONE-THIRD BUDGET
UNEF, whose 1960 budget is estimated at \$20,000,000, accounts for one-third of the UN budget of \$60,000,000.

Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld and other speaker extolled UNEF for its job in keeping the peace on the Egyptian border since the 1956 crisis but Hammarskjöld estimated that by the year's end it will be in the hole more than \$2,000,000. Member states have fallen down badly in their payments.

Canada was largely instrumental in creating the 5,350-man force after the invasion of Egypt by Britain, France and Israel during the 1956 Suez crisis. Canada's Lt-Gen. E. L. M. Burns, UNEF commander, was present for Tuesday's budgetary debate and sat in silence during numerous compliments to him and his men, who hail from Brazil, Colombia, Denmark, Norway, India, Sweden and Communist Yugoslavia as well as Canada.

German Output Is At New High

BOONN, West Germany (Reuters) — Industrial production in West Germany during October reached an all-time record, the economics ministry said Tuesday.

Provisional figures showed the production index nearly eight per cent up from October, 1958, with nearly all branches of industry involved.

Industrial production in the first 10 months of this year was six per cent higher than in the comparable period last year.

Seamen Fly Across Ocean

MONTREAL (CP)—A group of British seamen who refused to cross the Atlantic by ship started across it by air Tuesday night.

The 20 sailors of the freighter Westriver, currently being towed across the Atlantic from Halifax, left aboard Trans-Canada Air Lines flight 500 due in London at 10 a.m. AST.

They refused to board the Westriver, contending the 10,000-ton bulk cargo carrier was unseaworthy and would not be able to complete the low crossing.

A total of 21 men left the ship but one, Neil Smith, is Canadian and returned to his home at Saint John, N.B. The others agreed to voluntary repatriation, with transportation costs paid by the Westriver's owners, Westriver Ore Transport Limited.

Canada's immigration department in Halifax said the matter is cleaned up as far as it is concerned.

Disabled by engine trouble in the Great Lakes, the Westriver was towed to Halifax about two weeks ago to start her Atlantic crossing. She is being towed by the Dutch tug Gele Zee to South Shields, Eng., for repairs. Sixteen men, mostly officers, are aboard.

PM Personality Said Win Reason

OTTAWA (CP)—Allister Grosart, national director of the Progressive Conservative Party, said Tuesday the personality of John Diefenbaker in the 1957 federal election campaign offset a false image of the party created by the Liberals.

He was commenting on a speech by J. W. Pickersgill, Liberal Commons member for Bonaville-Twillingate, who in Kingston, Ont., Monday night quoted Mr. Grosart as saying in 1957 that the less Progressive Conservatives looked like Conservative Party the better their chance of being elected.

Mr. Grosart said in an interview Tuesday he had said the Progressive Conservatives were aware the Liberals had created a false image of the Conservative Party and that the personality of Mr. Diefenbaker was a complete offset to that image.

But he denied having said the less Progressive Conservatives looked like the Conservative Party the better their election chances.

Mr. Grosart also confirmed that he had distributed copies of a speech by former Liberal prime minister St. Laurent in which Mr. St. Laurent said Progressive Conservative printed 'Conservative Association' in small type with the emphases on the words "follow John."

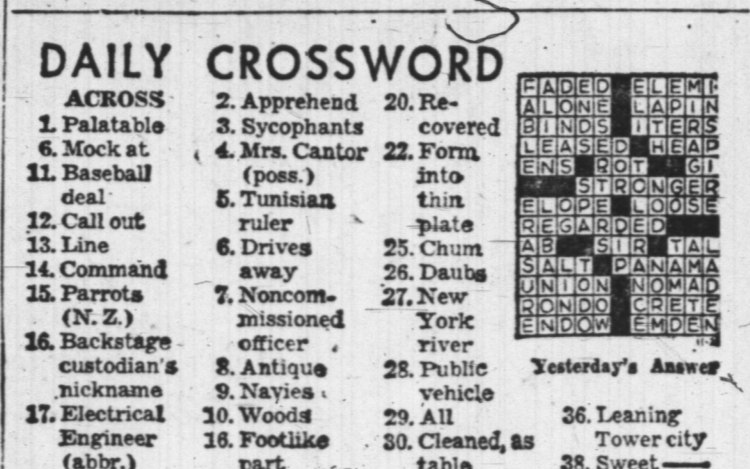

Tourist Campsite Debate Is Lively

OTTAWA (CP)—The question of whether charges should be made for the use of camping grounds along the Trans-Canada Highway touched off a lively debate Tuesday at the federal-provincial conference on tourism.

The debate centred round a report on the campsites, submitted by E. A. Cote, assistant deputy minister of northern affairs and national resources, who was presiding. He said eight provinces have agreed to join in the camp construction program.

Mr. Cote said that at the official level in participating provinces the "preponderant" feeling — by a margin of 5 to 3 — was that fees should be left to the discretion of the provinces.
