Red Cross Survey Shows Men, Boys Top Accident Victims

The Red Cross First Aid Services has been conducting home and farm safety programs in an effort to bring facts on accidents in this province to the attention of community-minded citizens throughout P.E.I.

The Red Cross has collected data from hospitals for the past five years. This information shows that accidents costing an alarming amount in time, money and life.

Approximately two thirds of accident victims are men or boys. The locale of the greatest number of accidents is the home. These and many other interesting facts provide serious topics for discussion groups at the home and farm safety meetings. Several new films are of marked interest to rural groups, especially farm tractor safety and fire on the farm.

Elmira, Lakesville and North Lake combined in one of these programs last week. The men and women who were present evidenced keen interest and plan to take further steps towards a safety campaign.
