BREEDERS' ASSOCIATION

President Elderkin and Others in the City

Four meetings To-night— Meeting in Charlottetown To-morrow.

Mr. E. B. Elderkin, of Amherst, President of the Stock Breeders' Association of the Maritime Provinces, and Mr. W. W. Hubbard, of Sussex, Secretary of the same Association arrived in Charlottetown this forenoon to be present at the meetings of the Association to be held at Charlottetown.

Accompanying them are Mr. F. W. Hodson, Dominion Live Stock Commissioner, Ottawa; Hon. John Dryden, Ontario Minister of Agriculture; Mr. J. H. Grisdal, Agriculturist of the Experimental Farm, Ottawa, and Mr. Bliss M. Fawcett, a prominent breeder of Sackville, all of whom will take an active part in the proceedings.

Mr. James Courtney, of London, England, will also attend the meetings. Mr. Courtney is one of the largest dealers of Canadian produce in the Old Country, and much of the Island output has passed through his hands. He is here to make the acquaintance of shippers and to make all concerned familiar with the class of produce desirable for the trade.

There will be meetings at Pownal, Marshfield, North Wiltshire and North River tonight, each of which will be addressed by two speakers representing the Association.

The regular meetings of the Association will begin at Charlottetown tomorrow forenoon and will be continued on Thursday. An interesting and instructive programme has been prepared.
