IN MEMORIAM

MR. HENRY J. CALLBECK

The death of Mr. Henry J. Callbeck of Parkdale occurred on July 18, 1950 after a brief illness in the Prince Edward Island Hospital. The late Mr. Callbeck was born at Tryon, P. E. I. in the year 1873, the son of the late Wellington and Millicent Callbeck. He moved to Charlottetown in 1905 and was employed at the Provincial Stock Farm until 1910 when he joined the Dominion Experimental Station which had just been established here. He was employed continuously at the Experimental Station until his retirement in 1940.

Mr. Callbeck was a faithful member of the Charlottetown Baptist Church and served its interests as deacon for over thirty years. The funeral service was held in the church on Thursday, July 20, and was conducted by a former pastor and close friend, Dr. Ross C. Eaton who was assisted by his son, Rev. Kenneth Eaton and Licentiate Byron Howlett. The honorary pallbearers were his fellow deacons: J. P. Gordon, Dr. J. A. Clark, A. K. MacPhee, P. J. Proud, S. H. Burhoe, and Louis Simmons. The active pallbearers were E. R. Hurst, E. F. Tinney, D. M. Robinson, W. C. S. McLure, J. A. Webster, T. G. Ives. Interment took place in the Peoples' Cemetery.

He leaves to mourn his widow, Ethel Louise Campbell, whom he married in 1901, and three children, Mabel, Mrs. Ernest MacKay of Parkdale; Lorne of Charlottetown; Helen, Mrs. Walter Pearson of Sussex, New Brunswick. 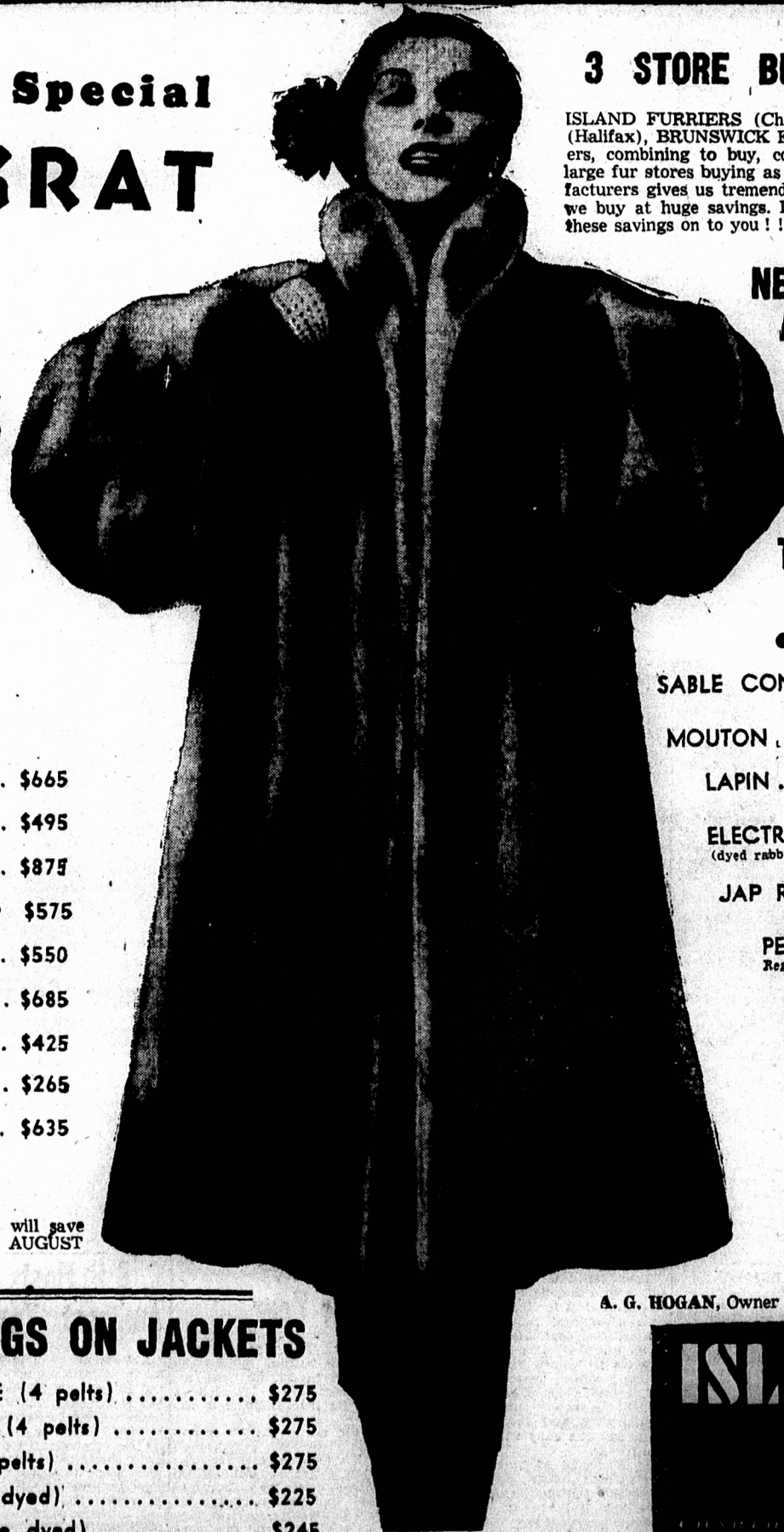
