

# FEATURE VALUES IN HOLIDAY NEEDS at SMALLMAN'S

### Annual Meeting O'Leary Fire Dept.

— There was a splendid attendance on Monday night, June 19 in the O'Leary Public Hall when the annual meeting and election of officers of the O'Leary Fire Department was held. Harry Williams was chairman and Albert Noonan secretary. The secretary gave the financial report and read the minutes of the last annual meeting. On behalf of the O'Leary Women's Institute who canvassed the residents of O'Leary for the new fire hose, Mrs. Harry MacWilliams reported the fine sum of \$208. was received and several men gave their contributions to this worthy fund at the meeting.

The Fire Chief Lloyd Silliker gave the meeting a short account of the equipment which the O'Leary Fire Dept. has at the present time. He said there were 1200 feet of hose but only about 200 feet were serviceable. The Department has two pumps, two hose reels, one 130 foot extension ladder, nozzles, two chemical tanks but had no pressure gauges on the pumps.

A committee of five were appointed to survey the fire equipment and make a full report of all the essential equipment necessary, such report to be presented to another citizens meeting to be held in the O'Leary Hall next Monday night, June 26. The following are the members of the committee: — Lloyd Silliker, Douglas Hardy, E. W. Turner, Albert Dunville and Harry MacWilliams.

The following are the officers of the Fire Department who were elected at the meeting: — Fire Chief — Lloyd Silliker, (re-elected); Pump Men — Stanley and Albert Dunville, (re-elected); Nozzlemen — Art Gallant, Dan Saunders and E. W. Turner, (re-elected); Hosemen — Therin Ellis, Ken Matheson, Emmerson Smallman, Foster Ellis, Ken Buchanan, Lewis Bernard, Ernest Phillips, Leith Ellis, W. Brooks, also Thomas Phillips, representative of the Maritime Electric Co. in O'Leary who will be on hand to look after the wiring when a fire breaks out. Dr. L. G. Dewar and Dr. McMurdo were appointed to see that no automobiles drove over the hose lines during a blaze.

The following received unanimous votes of thanks: — Milton Smallman, proprietor of the Verdun Theater in O'Leary for giving a benefit show for the Fire Dept.; Mr. Albert Noonan, the efficient secretary, who was re-appointed and it was voted to pay him a small salary for his devoted service; the Women's Institute who made a canvass for funds for the department; Mr. Lloyd Silliker for his conscientious and capable services as the fire chief; Mr. Lewis Bernard for his much appreciated services looking after the Fire Hall. It was decided to interview Mr. Bernard to see if he would continue to act in this capacity and the meeting decided to pay him a small salary. It was decided to interview the Telephone and the Electric Light Companies to see if they would give their services free to the fire hall. The president for this year is Mr. John Matthews, who is re-elected.

The important question of partial incorporation was then brought up and discussed briefly. The feeling is growing that if O'Leary is to have needed services such as street lights and a sewage system, etc., the community must be partially incorporated at least. It was decided to ask Hon. Mr. Cullen of Charlottetown to come to O'Leary and present the facts for partial incorporation to a citizens meeting to be held in the O'Leary Public Hall on Monday, June 26, or if that date did not suit the Minister, on the date most convenient for him. The meeting then adjourned. — O.

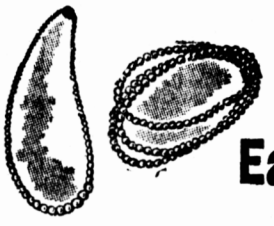

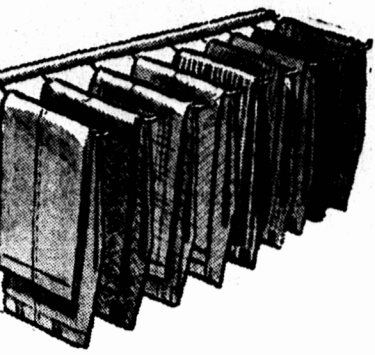
