

Anglican Boys Attend Camp

Two Church Camps were held simultaneously at Camp Kingston, Crapaud, from July 8-15th, under the auspices of the Anglican Church on the Island. The Senior Camp for boys 13-16 years was under the direction of Dr. F. Jelks, Charlottetown. The Junior Camp for boys 9-12 years was under the direction of the Rev. W. Eric Ingraham, Kensington. Boys came from the several Parishes on the Island.

The Senior Camp Programme consisted of Bible study, swimming, recreation, and a short work period each day. The Bible study was led by the Rev. W.E. Ingraham. He took as his theme "Prayer and Its Various Forms." Biblical passages as directives and as examples were searched out and then applied to the Service of Holy Communion. Each day the boys looked for the note of adoration, thanksgiving, confession, petition, and intercession in the service. Near the end of the course the boys tried writing their own prayers and constructive criticism was made of each. Their daily work periods consisted of cleaning up the camp grounds and thinning the trees so they will grow properly.

The Junior Camp programme consisted of Bible study, handicrafts, swimming, and recreation. Bible study was led by the Rev. M.J. Findlay of Port Hill. The theme was "The Great Church Family At Worship." The aim of worship and the directives for sound worship were well emphasized.

Mr. Horace Cole, Milton, supervised handicrafts. His entailed each boy making glittercraft pictures and a small Cross for their own inspiration at home. Ron Nisbet and Ron England of Tyne Valley directed the sports and assisted the Senior Camp Leader. Besides organized sports teaching, competitive games were held each evening followed by Camp Fire. At the latter stories were told, skits and jokes acted and songs sung.

The swimming instructing was under the capable leadership of Fred Hyndman of Charlottetown. At the end of the week the boys were tested by Mr. Paul Cudmore, of the Red Cross Safe Swimming Committee. The following were passed:

Mr. Hyndman worked long and patiently to achieve as much as possible in the short period of the camp.

The overall success of the camp was ensured by the excellent cooking of Mr. Henry Miller, who not only fed the boys but in spare moments entertained them.

Production Of Newsprint In June Higher

MONTREAL (CP) — Canadian newsprint production in June totalled 536,357 tons, an increase of 28,533 tons over June, 1955, the Newspaper Association of Canada reported Thursday.

Shipments amounted to 483,319 tons last month against 450,319 in June last year. In the first six months of this year shipments totalled 2,558,419 tons compared with 2,493,595 in the corresponding period last year.

Total Canadian production for the six-month period was 3,106,159 up from 3,056,960 tons.

United States newspapers used more newsprint in June than in any other June in history, and North American mills chalked up a production record in an effort to keep up with demand.

The American Newspaper Publishers Association reported in New York total newsprint consumption in June rose to 555,738 tons, compared with 555,587 tons in the same month a year ago. For the first half of the year, consumption totalled a record 3,413,621 tons against 3,285,624 tons in the same period in 1955.

The newsprint service bureau reported June newsprint production in North America amounted to 678,274 tons, an all-time high for the month, compared with 640,742 tons in June, 1955.

Tito, Nehru And Nasser

BRIONI, Yugoslavia (AP)—Prime Minister Nehru of India and Egypt's President Nasser concluded talks Thursday night with President Tito of Yugoslavia on Middle East, Algerian, disarmament and German problems.

Tito said a joint declaration of their stand will be made public simultaneously today in Cairo, Belgrade and New Delhi.

Nasser and Nehru left for Cairo immediately after the 12 hours of talks ended. They flew in an Egyptian Viscount plane.

Tito told reporters who clustered around him after the two others departed. "We have been talking about various problems of interest to the three countries, and also different international problems which are topical now."

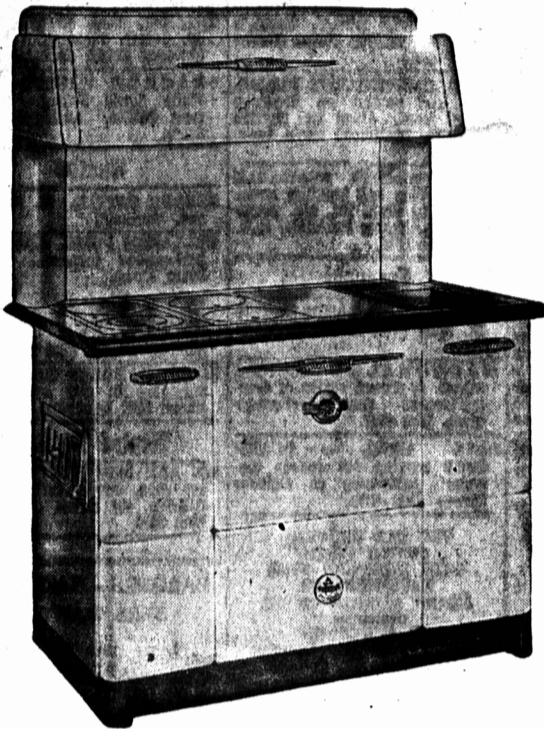

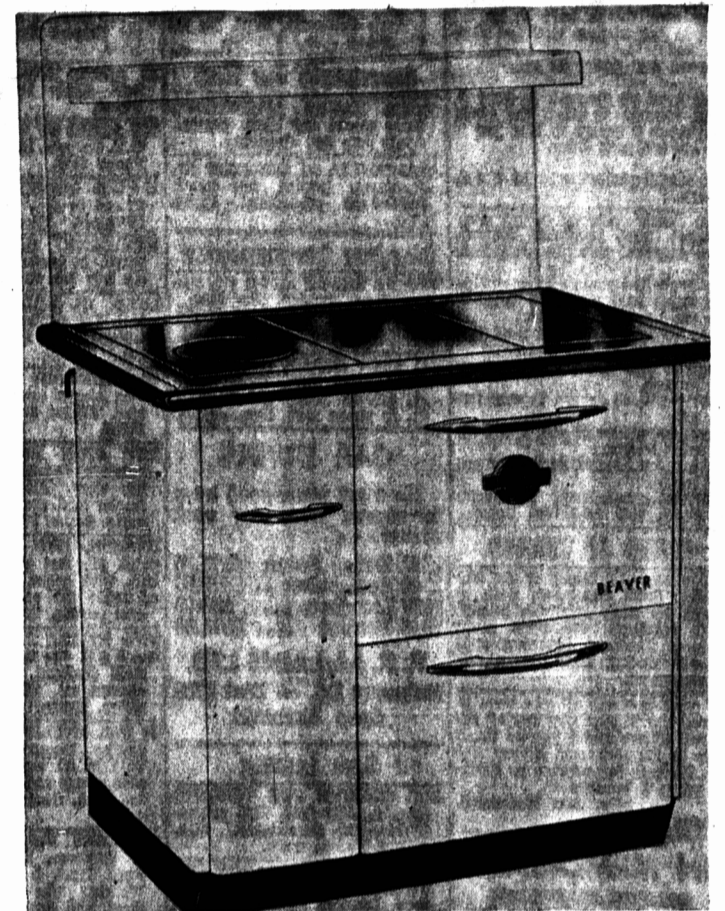

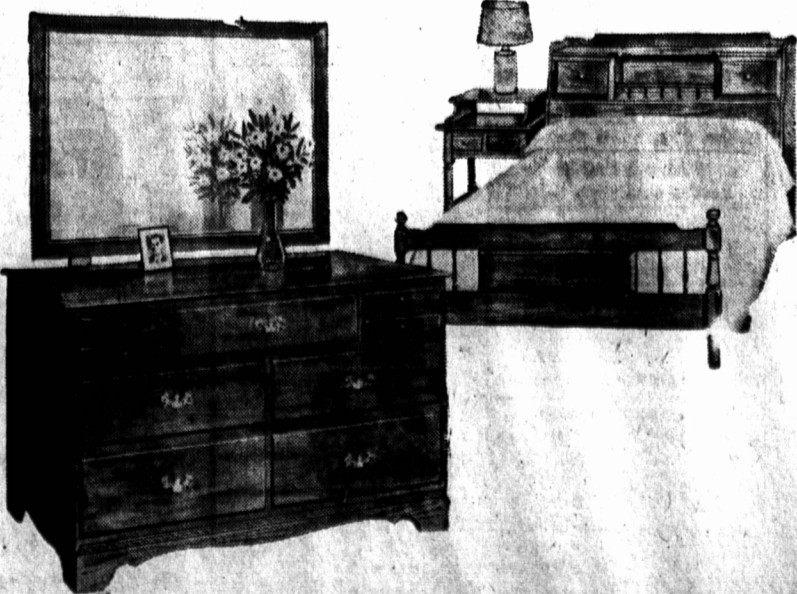
