Bankers Feature Canadian Business

 Takeovers—factual and fanciful—continued to spawn vigorous action on the Canadian business scene last week.
 The takeover picture to enter the picture was the takeover of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce Ltd., which was offered to purchase the International Building Corporation Ltd. for \$75.25 a share.
 The takeover is a Toronto-based firm specializing in improvements loans. The offer is conditional upon acceptance of at least 33 per cent or 165,000 of the International Building Corporation's shares. Mercantile Credit Co. Ltd., International's largest shareholder with 125,000 shares has indicated it will accept the offer.
 Should the offer be accepted, it will be Traders second acquisition in the last three weeks.
 Two weeks ago Traders, in partnership with National Overseas Finance Corporation, Montreal, entered the factoring business with the acquisition of Aetna Factors of Canada Ltd. Factoring is the taking over of accounts receivable in the field of corporate financing.
TAKE NEW LOOK
 On the oil scene the Triad of Devon Palmer took a new look. Four of the Devon Palmer directors two weeks ago asked shareholders to sell their shares on the Triad offer of 90 cents a share on the grounds that the other companies might be interested in purchasing the company or its shares.

O'Brien Makes Accusation In Book On Cong Events

 LONDON (AP)—Conor Cruise O'Brien, Irish ex-ambassador to Canada, has accused a false United Nations account of why and how the first battle of accounts receivable in the field of corporate financing began in September, 1961.
 Hammarskjöld, Swedish chief of the UN died in an air crash soon afterward and 11 weeks later O'Brien was re-elected from UN service on the initiative of Hammarskjöld's successor, U. Thant of Burma.
 O'Brien's book, "The UN and the Congo," is a representative in the unsuccessful UN effort to reunite that rich secessionist province with the larger and poorer Congo.
 O'Brien's accusation is in a book written to give his version of what went on behind the Elsenhede scenes.
 At one point on the book, entitled "Katanga and Back," O'Brien says that Hammarskjöld Saturday—O'Brien said of Haremskjöld:
SAYS CONCEALED TRUTH
 He allowed the world to be given an official version which was so phrased as to conceal the reality of what had happened, making what had been an active intervention by the United Nations look like a defensive action.
 O'Brien also maintained that the UN account of why and how the fighting started—embodied in Security Council document S-8490 of Sept. 14—was false on two crucial points.
 The UN launched operation play when he ducked. If he had answered with the question, "South would have made the contract. Declarator would draw three rounds of trumps and lead a low heart towards dummy."

 Particularly enough, South could have made the hand by an unusual play. If he had played the eight instead of the ten of hearts on the opening spade. South East plays the nine on the eight. South wins with a club and leads four rounds of trumps. No line of defence can then stop him from getting through East's queen.
 If East ducked the eight completely, South would have ent. The queen eventually gets trapped in the same way.
 This hand was in a case that illustrates the importance of the first play. That's what declarator should do in his most serious thinking.

 O'Brien quit the Irish diplomatic service to write his book. Now he is vice-chancellor at the University of Ghana in Accra.
