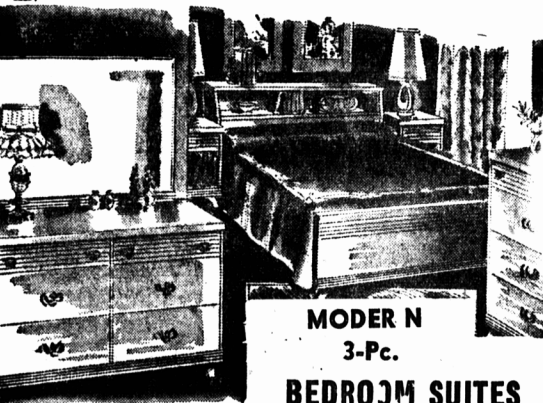

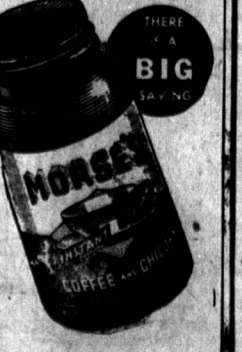
Mrs. Eldon Miller and Mrs. Earl Atkinson were asked to make posters for a pantry sale to be held the second Saturday of April.

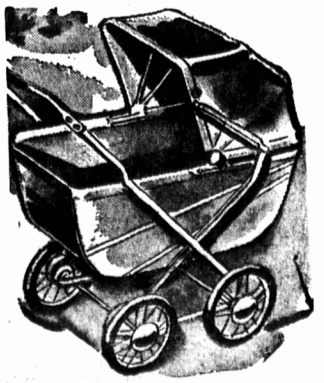

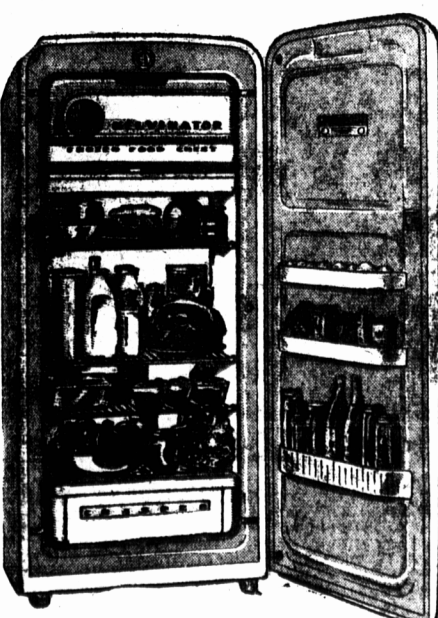
