Diefenbaker Denies Russian Allegations Re U.S. Planes

OTTAWA (CP) — Prime Minister Diefenbaker Tuesday denied categorically Russian allegations that nuclear-armed United States aircraft flying over Canada had come close to Soviet territory. The prime minister told the Commons, amplifying a reference he made Monday to a letter from Russian Premier Nikita Khrushchev, that such U.S. aircraft do fly over Canadian territory.
