



### CLAN MacLEOD SOCIETY FORMED

The strong emphasis that Islanders of Scottish ancestry have placed on the preservation of the traditions and culture of Scotland received an added impetus recently with the establishment on May 30th of a Clan MacLeod Society of Prince Edward Island.

Like similar organizations in other sections of the English-speaking world, the Island clansmen will seek to preserve the kinship, background and tradition of the Clan MacLeod, one of the ancient clans whose origin lies deep in the history of the Western Isles.

The qualifications for membership in this society are as follows: 1. all persons having the surname of MacLeod, however spelled; 2. all persons directly connected by marriage with, or descended from persons bearing the name of MacLeod; 3. sons or adherents of the Clan MacLeod as sanctioned by the Lord Lyon.

### Error Bars Bride Of Immigrant

TORONTO (CP) — A Toronto chemical engineer says Canadian immigration authorities in India have refused to rectify a mistake they made in examining his bride of three months for admission to Canada and that he will have to wait at least a year before she can join him here.

Krishan Sood, 30, who immigrated to Canada in 1953, said he flew to New Delhi to marry his 25-year-old childhood sweetheart last Feb. 25. He gave his account of what followed.

Dr. Raj Dogra, assistant to the chief Canadian medical officer in New Delhi, examined his wife and said she had trachoma, a highly infectious eye disease, and was not fit to emigrate to Canada.

Mr. Sood had his wife examined by two of India's leading eye specialists who gave him written affidavits that she was free of the disease. Dr. W. Buckler, chief Canadian medical officer, also examined her in a private capacity and cleared her.

Dr. Dogra re-examined Mrs. Sood, admitted that his original diagnosis was wrong and wrote to immigration attache Allen Graham asking that the error be rectified.

Mr. Sood said he appealed to Mr. Graham for another official examination but was told his wife "isn't entitled to another examination for a year."
