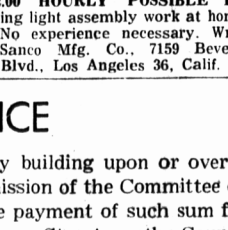

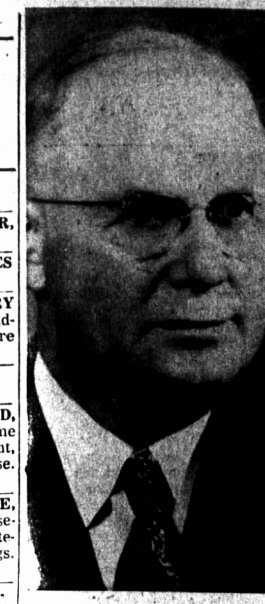

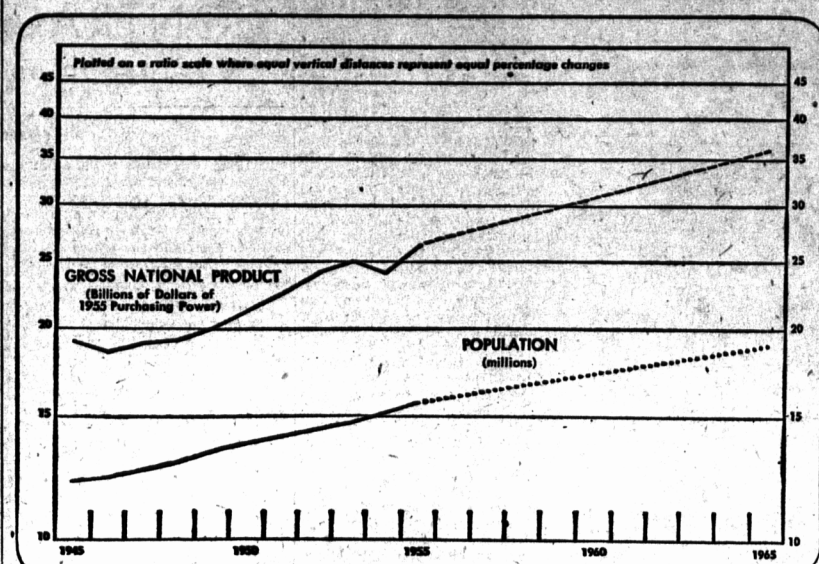

CANADA'S POSTWAR AND POSSIBLE FUTURE GROWTH



A Canadian population of more than 19 million and a gross national product of \$66 billion ten years from now are foreseen by the Bank of Montreal in its January Business Review, just issued.

TO provide opportunities for fruitful development. The past ten years, the review continues, has seen the relative significance of external trade diminish. It adds, however, that this declining trend may not continue at the same rate during the next decade.

Canada May Not Compete In Future

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada appears destined to become the main outside supplier of iron ore for the voracious steel mills of the United States.

When the figures are all in for last year, shipments of iron ore from Canada's three main fields are expected to tally some 10,000,000 tons.

But in 1954, following development of Steep Rock in northwest Ontario and the Quebec-Labrador field, shipments rose to just over 8,000,000 tons.

The upward trend is expected to continue at a steady pace, says E. H. Maguire, Canadian commercial secretary in Washington.

Writing in the trade department fortnightly publication "Foreign Trade," he said U.S. domestic production of iron ore has reached a peak and is expected to decline gradually while requirements for the ore grow.

IMPORTANT SOURCE
"Canada will become increasingly important as a source—probably the chief outside source."

He said the U.S. bureau of mines estimates that Canadian shipments of iron ore to that country will rise to an annual rate of 38,000,000 tons by 1970-75—or almost four times what they were last year.

The figure would represent about 21 per cent of the estimated total U.S. requirements by that time.

"Imports of iron ore into the United States have traditionally played a minor part in the overall supply picture, but as time goes on, they will become increasingly important."

In the period 1943-47, imports represented less than two per cent of requirements, averaging under 2,000,000 tons annually.

They rose to 5,000,000 tons in 1948, and the estimate for last year is 23,000,000 and for 1970-75, 68,000,000. Canada and Venezuela, the main suppliers, Brazil, West Africa, Sweden and Norway contributing smaller amounts.

Cypriots Discuss New Proposals

NICOSIA, Cyprus (Reuters)—Archbishop Makarios, leader of the Cyprus union-with-Greece movement, called a series of emergency meetings of a wide cross-section of the Cypriot Greek community Sunday night to discuss new British proposals on the future of the island.

He called the meetings a few hours after the 15th British soldier to be killed by terrorists on Cyprus had died in a Paphos hospital.

The meeting will be held during the next few days and will discuss proposals submitted in writing to the archbishop Saturday by British Governor Sir John Harding, following a 2 1/2-hour meeting between the two Friday night.

In addition, the archbishop council supreme body of the Greek Church in Cyprus, will hold a special meeting today to consider the proposals.

The consultative meeting is expected to urge the demanding of immediate self-determination and the release of all political detainees held under the emergency regulations before any discussions of the future of the island are held. Among the political detainees are 130 Communist leaders.

PRESS OPTIMISTIC
The archbishop's call was interpreted here as in line with his promise that he will not commit himself to an agreement until he has consulted the people and with his wish to impress on Harding that a reply to the British proposals will be given in the full force of Cypriot Greek representative opinion.

Optimistic press reports predicted agreement.

The English-language Times of Cyprus reported that the archbishop had "broadly agreed" to this new British formula for Cyprus' future.
