SDU Registrar Attends Meet

Michael Hennessey, registrar of St. Dunstan's University, is attending the bi-annual conference of Canadian university registrars at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, N.B. Mr. Hennessey left Saturday to attend the conference, to be held June 21 to 23. Upwards of 100 persons from universities across Canada are expected to attend the three-day conference which will end Wednesday.

This marks the first time the Registrars' Conference has been held in the Atlantic Provinces. Items on the agenda include a study of the Parent Commission Report, the use of electronic and data processing equipment, the year-round college, a panel discussion on the constitution of the registrars' association, and an address on federal grants to higher education by Dr. E. F. Sheffield, director of research for the Canadian Universities Foundation.

UNB president Colin B. McKay will host a reception and dinner for the visitors on opening night, while on Tuesday evening they will be guests of the province of New Brunswick at a dinner at which the guest speaker will be Hon. Louis J. Robichaud, premier of New Brunswick.
