



**CHURCH PROJECT IS ON SCHEDULE**

Of a revolutionary design for Prince Edward Island, the construction of the new Church of the Most Holy Redeemer, located at the northern end of Spring Park Road, is reported to be moving along on schedule. The outer walls of the almost round edifice are practically completed, and workmen can be seen, in the photo, engaged in the erection of the steeple, which will house the church bells. Completion of the church is expected early in 1964, along with the new rectory which will provide assistance for the Redemptorist Fathers.

**British Gov't Moves To Halt 'Brain Drain'**

LONDON (Reuters) — The British government is taking action on a six-point plan to halt the "brain drain" of scientists who go to the United States, it was disclosed here.

Britain's advisory council on scientific policy said action is being taken by the government on three of its recommendations.

These were a review of university salaries, quicker award of research grants and increased research budgets for universities.

The council's annual report said the salary review is well advanced while Science Minister Lord Hailsham has announced more research grants and stops are being taken to speed their award.

The council made these and three other recommendations to Hailsham in May after studies showed a high proportion of scientists and top university men were emigrating to the U.S.

The other three proposals were increasing the number of senior university posts, an increase in technical aid for university research and post-doctoral fellowships to bring "brain drain" men back to Britain.

The council report said bigger American salaries and better social status for scientists there were among the reasons British scientists left home.
