**Caledonian Society Plans 101st Gathering**

On Wednesday, August 4, the 101st gathering of the Caledonian Society of P.E.I. will be held at Selkirk Park near Eton. The society held its first field day as a regular event of its activities in 1864. At that time this club was constituted to include all Scotsmen, both Highlanders and Lowlanders and their descendants, with the object of preserving and perpetuating in Prince Edward Island the national dress, music, dancing and athletic games of the people of Scotland and promote their welfare. At all these annual gatherings prizes are awarded for proficiency in pipe music, for dancing the sword, fling and other Caledonian dances, as well as for putting the stone, throwing the hammer, tossing the caber etc.

**FIRST MET IN 1864**  
The first such gathering took place August 16, 1864, on the grounds of historic Government House and later that year Mrs. Dundas, wife of the then Governor-General, presented the society with an illuminated chart of the coats of arms and tartans of the different Scottish clans. The following year the annual games were held at Summerside for the first time outside Charlottetown. In 1894 Lord and Lady Aberdeen, he being Governor-General at that time, were entertained at the field sports, held that year in Georgetown. In 1900 Lord and Lady Minto were the guests at the annual gathering held in Charlottetown. **EARLY AS 1873**  
The Caledonia Society originated from the Highland Society of P.E.I. which was formed in Charlottetown in 1837, the year the old St. Andrew's Society affiliated with the Highland Society of London. The first St. Andrew's Day celebration on P.E.I.

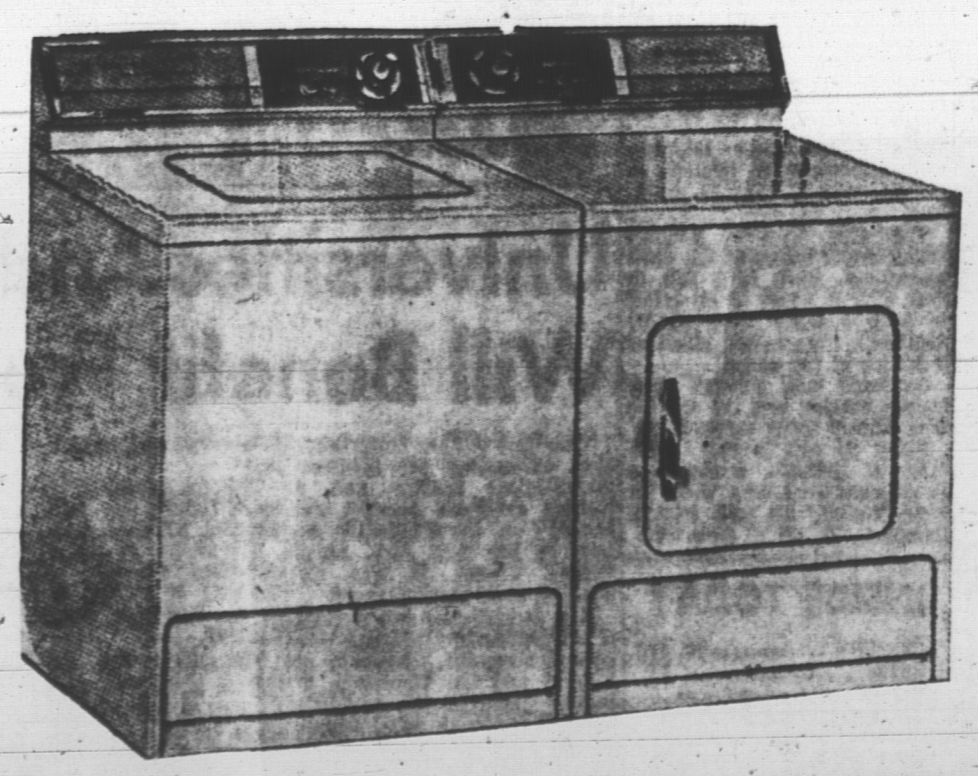
