SLOW LOBSTER SEASON - Latest reports from the lobster packers and fishermen in the Alberton and Tignish areas are that no lobsters have been landed as yet at these points owing to continued bad weather and high seas. All of the fishermen at Tignish points have managed to put out some gear with very few having all their traps put out yet. At Alberton South the same condition applies with a large number of traps still piled on the wharves. With the weather remaining cold and windy it is not expected that any lobsters will be brought in before the middle of next week.

PROPERTY SOLD - Mr. Leslie Simmonds, of Simmonds and MacFarlane, announced last evening that the extensive farm property of Simmonds and MacFarlane at Freetown, consisting of 260 acres of land in high state of cultivation, has been sold to Mr. Fred Payne of Kelvin. Mr. Payne is to be congratulated on acquiring this fine property which is one of the best in this Province. The property of Mr. Payne has been sold to Mr. Crawford Picketts of Kelvin. Mr. Simmonds said that the sale did not include the machinery and stock which will be sold by private sale.

IN MAGISTRATE'S COURT - In magistrate's court at Alberton yesterday with Magistrate R. S. Hinton, K. C., presiding, a party from Miminigash was charged under the Highway Traffic Act with failing to give right of way and fined five dollars and costs. A truck owner from Tignish, also charged under the Highway Traffic Act with operating a truck overweight, was fined ten dollars and costs. A party from DeBolis was charged under the Temperance Act with being intoxicated in a public place and fined twenty dollars and costs. Under the same act a party from Tignish charged with illegal possession had the case adjourned for judgment. Two parties from Miminigash charged with assault were dismissed for lack of evidence. A person from St. Louis charged with indecent exposure under the Criminal Code was fined ten dollars and costs. The prosecution was conducted by the R. C. M. P. of Alberton Detachment. No counsel was present. Court adjourned until May 18th.
