

CIMN surveyed

The University of Prince Edward Island's Student Union Executive requested to the UPEI Engineering Society to undertake a project. The project was to expand the UPEI Student Radio Station CIMN Audio on campus.

The UPEI Engineering Society appointed three engineers to the project: David Brown, Harold French, and Ronnie St. Onge.

The Engineers worked with the CIMN's management in coming up with a solution. Finally, after three months

of consultations, the group decided to place a sound system in the Robertson Library Lounge. This proposal was accepted by the Student Union Executive.

The Sound system in the Lounge was in operation by March 13, 1981. This system costs approximately \$50. It was agreed on by the Engineers to put in a temporary system until a proper survey of the validity of operating CIMN was taken.

Fifty on and off campus students were surveyed.

The first four questions were on the sound system in the Lounge and the fifth question was on whether CIMN should remain open or not. A final comment was asked from each student.

The table below is a tabulation of the five questions from the survey:

1. Do you agree with the Sound system in the library? Yes 86% No 14%

2. CIMN turns on at 12 p.m. every day. Do you agree with this time? Yes 68% No 32%

3. Do you agree with the variety of the music on CIMN? Yes 62% No 38%

4. Are you receiving sufficient news from CIMN? Yes 42% No 58%

5. Do you think CIMN should remain operational? Yes 96% No 4%

expanding next year through a possible hook-up with cable FM. But for this year, broadcasting will end some time this week.
