Montague To Have New Four-room School Unit, Meeting Decides

Montague school district is to have a new four-classroom school unit, it was decided last evening at the annual school meeting held at the High School. The motion was moved by Mr. Dan MacDonald and seconded by Mayor B. H. Yeo, and included in the motion was the voting of \$40,000, to cover the cost of the unit. Mr. C. R. Boehner moved an amendment seconded by Mr. Charles Boudreau that a six-room unit be erected. A ballot vote was taken and the amendment was defeated 38 to 23. The trustees have now been authorized to go ahead with the construction of the four-room unit, and questions as to when, where and how will be the first problems to be met by the board.

The chairman, Mr. S. S. Hessian, called on Hon. Keir Clark, M. L. A., chairman of the planning committee, to present a report of the committee's findings. Mr. Clark gave a very comprehensive report, and also a tabulation of the costs of different sized schools with and without auditorium, the cost of amortization, and the consequent effect on the school tax rate.

Summarized the report showed the following facts: Present assessment of district, \$659,850.00. Present tax rate, \$1.25. Amount of receipt after deductions, \$8,254.01; new tax rate with 4-room unit over twenty-year period, \$2.06; with 5-room unit over twenty-year period, \$2.20; with 6-room unit over twenty-year period, \$2.60; with 6-room unit and auditorium over twenty-year period, \$4.05.

\$7,000 Voted At Souris High School Meeting

The annual school meeting of the Souris High School was held last night, with Mr. Roy Crockett, chairman of the Board of Trustees, presiding. The minutes of the last meeting, inspector's report, trustees' report and auditor's report were read by the secretary, Mr. M. J. McQuaid. The inspector in his report congratulated the Sisters of St. Mary's Convent on the splendid condition of their school, scoring 241 points out of a possible of 250. The High School scored 208 points.

The trustees in their report congratulated the janitor on the splendid condition of the high school during the past year. Mr. Roy Crockett was re-elected to the Board of Trustees for another term and Mr. A. T. MacDonald was re-elected auditor. The Reeves appointed are Mr. Joseph Mahar and Mr. Bernard Clinton.
