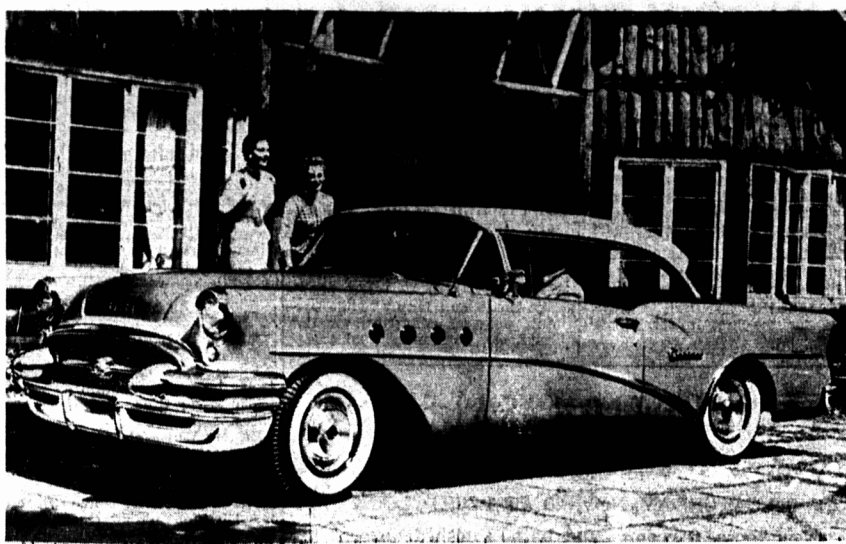
Miss Carol Barnett, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Barnett is making a good recovery in the Western Hospital.
