### CHANGES IN CANDIDATURE

To Prevent Division W. F. McLean  
Retires From East York.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

TORONTO, Oct. 3.—W. F. McLean, M. P., made a sudden coup in the local political situation yesterday by sending in his resignation as the Conservative candidate in East York. He followed this up with a telegram to Sir Charles Tupper asking permission to resign his seat in parliament.

Mr. McLean's action, which is a decided surprise to the local politicians, is due to the protest of Ward One Association against Mr. McLean's nomination at a convention held two weeks ago.

Mr. McLean has been offered two nominations elsewhere,—one, it is said, for a Manitoba constituency, by the Hon. Hugh John Macdonald.

H. H. Cook, formerly Liberal M. P. for East Simcoe, announces his willingness to contest East York in the Conservative interest.

### STARTS CANCER ENQUIRY.

Prussia Calls on Every Physician to  
Report on Cases Treated.

LONDON, Oct. 1.—The Prussian Government has initiated systematic enquiries with a view to amplifying the world's knowledge on the subject of cancer. Every registered physician has received a paper of questions, calling upon him to give his experiences in cancer cases. The principal points are whether cancer is hereditary and contagious, whether it is connected with a particular habit, such as indulgence in alcohol, tobacco, etc., and whether it is more prevalent in one district than another.

### French Naval Visitor.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.—The department of state has been informed by the French embassy that Rear Admiral Richard, in charge of the French naval division in the Atlantic now at Sydney, C. E., contemplates visiting the coast of North America with the Cecille on which his flag is hoisted for the good of the crew's health.

### MELBOURNE

To be Capital of Confederated Aus-  
tralia.

### Transvaal Refugees.

LOURENZO MARQUES, Oct. 2.—The Austrian steamer Lyria Lloyd has sailed from here, having on board four hundred Transvaal refugees, part of them being Irish Americans. All their expenses have been paid by the Transvaal government. Each man received \$7.50, and will be paid \$42.50 on landing at any port which may be elected by them.

### Fatal Explosion.

LOURENZO MARQUES, Oct. 2.—An explosion occurred at Komatiport while the British were destroying the Boer ammunition, resulting in the death of two of the Gordon Highlanders. Eighteen others were wounded.

### "Bobs" and Kitchener.

LONDON, Oct. 2.—The Times, in an editorial reference this morning to the appointment of Lord Roberts as commander-in-chief, hints that Lord Kitchener will come home to assist him at his new post.

### Powell in Charge.

PRETORIA, Oct. 2.—General Baden-Powell has arrived here to take command of the police in the Transvaal and Orange River colony, where it is proposed to maintain a force of 12,000 under General Baden-Powell.

### South African Honors.

LONDON, Sept. 30.—The Queen now has a long list of names submitted to her as those of persons worthy of honors for service in South Africa. The identity of those who figure in this list is already causing keen speculation in certain circles. The shower of C. B's (Companion of the Bath) C. M. G's (Companion of St. Michael and St. George) etc., will be unprecedented.

Lord Kitchener, it is said, will be given the local rank of full general, so that he can be second in command to General Buller, after Lord Roberts leaves.
