

Caribou Season Is Scheduled

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Caribou will be legal game for hunters on Newfoundland's eastern Avalon Peninsula during the last two weeks of September this year for the first time in 42 years. Resources Minister W. J. Keough said here. 40 licenses will be available to residents of the peninsula and a lottery will be held if more than 40 applications are received. Only stag caribou may be taken legally. The minister said in a statement the peninsula herd has increased to 600 animals in the last decade from about 100.
