The express company will open its office at Nazareth, and the messenger boy will jostle the Levite in the Jew's waiting-place.

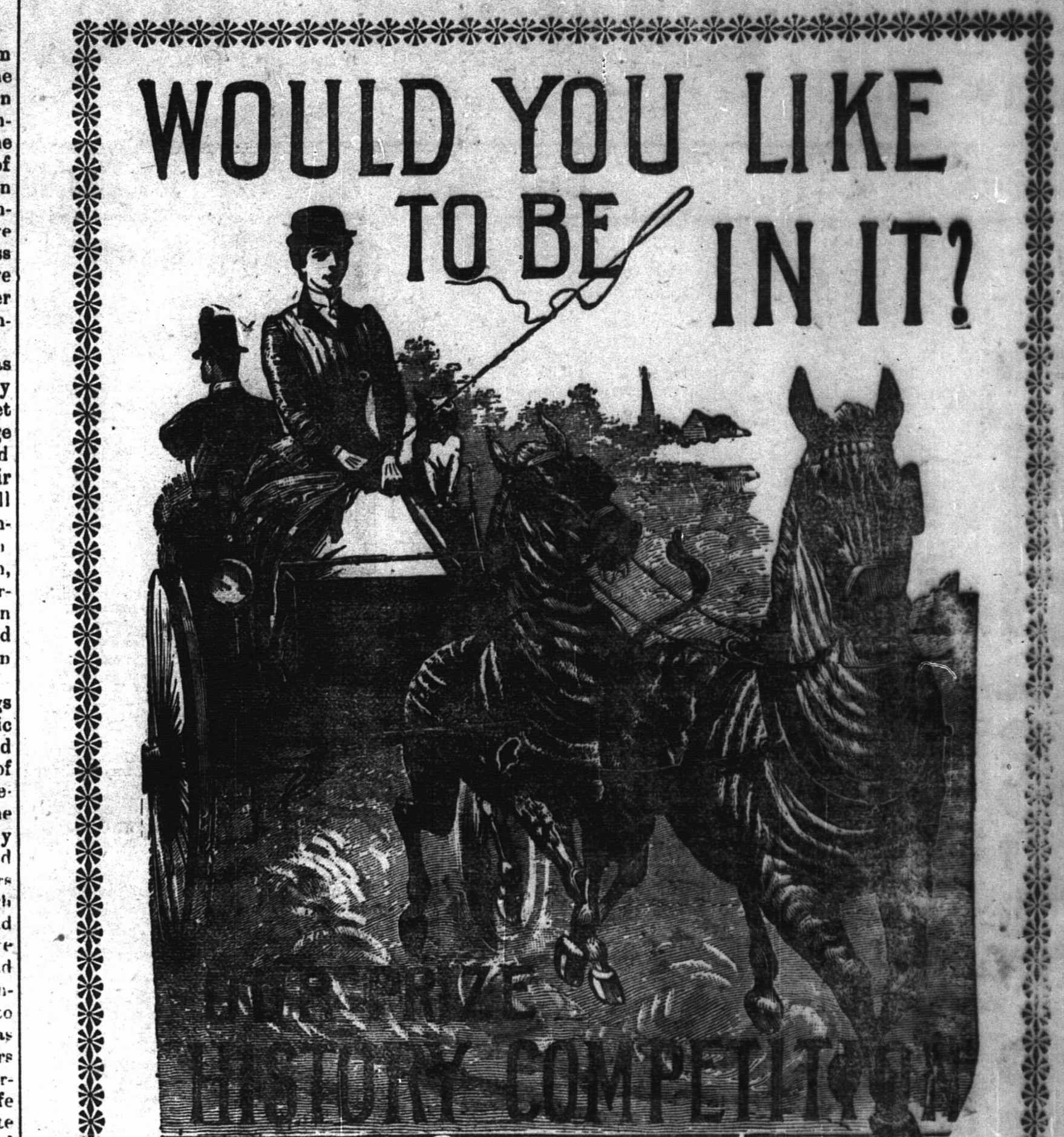
