Convicted Red May Refuse To Leave The U. S.

NEW YORK, March 14 (AP)—Valentin A. Gubitchev probably will refuse to leave the United States next Monday rather than lose his right to appeal his conviction on spy conspiracy charges his lawyer said today.

"The deal is off," lawyer Abraham L. Pomerantz told reporters. Pomerantz had said earlier that Gubitchev—given the choice between going to prison for 15 years or returning to his native Russia—would sail Monday on the liner Batory.

Today, however, the lawyer said the plans have been changed because the Government insists on Gubitchev giving up all right of appeal if he leaves the country.

United States Attorney Irving H. Saypol confirmed that Gubitchev would have to drop his appeal if he wants to leave the United States.

Gubitchev was convicted along with Joseph Coplon, former Justice Department employee last week on charges of conspiring to spy for the Russians.

Federal Judge Sylvester J. Ryan sentenced each of them to 15 years in prison. On the Government's recommendation, he said he would suspend Gubitchev's sentence if the Soviet engineer left the country "never to return."

Filed To Conclude Employment Program

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., March 14 (C P)—Newfoundland's four-month-old work-relief program will end tomorrow because it proved too costly, Premier Smallwood announced in the Legislature today.

The relief administration, providing aid to some 10,000 unemployed throughout the Island, will be replaced Thursday with a temporary system to take care of the destitute.

The Government paid \$1,679,000 for the program, under which a man nominally received 55 cents hourly, but actually 27 1/2 cents because he was required to work one free day for every day paid.

Value of work done—projects ranging from road building to grave building—was \$1,660,000. The plan, said the Premier, was "enormously expensive" but "startlingly successful." Some 111 miles of road were constructed.

The temporary scheme, to deal with persons "literally" destitute, would run until next fall, when something of a permanent nature likely will be established.
