

# RC Unity Concept Given In Outline

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Roman Catholic Church made plain Wednesday that its concept of Christian unity is not the same as that advocated by non-Catholics.

The Protestant idea of "ecumenicalism" — universality of

# Winchell Threatens To Quit Job

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Walter Winchell said Wednesday he wants to quit as a columnist for the Hearst organization because, he says, some of his criticisms of Communism and the Kennedy administration have been deleted by syndicate editors.

Winchell started writing for

the New York Mirror 24 years ago.

"I'll be kicking away \$100,000 a year but I'll do it," he told a reporter, "even though I am 53 years old."

Winchell said that while 15 columns have been appearing in full in the Mirror, part of some dealing with his communist campaign and a column here at the White House have been cut out of syndication by King Features. Both the Mirror and King Features are part of the Hearst organization.

In New York, no comment was available from the Hearst Corporation, the Mirror's parent.

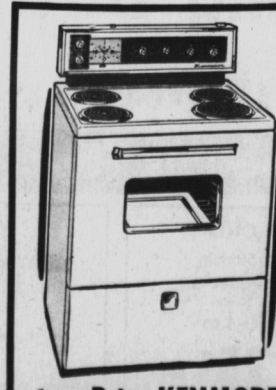
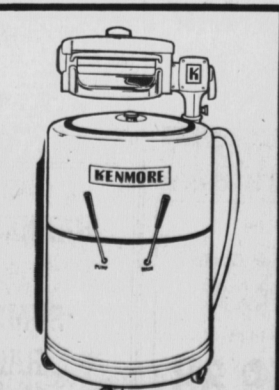

# Actress Annoyed By Red Actions

MOSCOW (AP) — Shirley MacLaine is so frustrated by 10 days in the Soviet Union that she said Wednesday night she would like to come back and "dance the can-can naked in the Red Square every May Day."

The frustrations of the Hollywood actress included robbery of her baggage in Leningrad, a balky draw bridge and being tossed out of her hotel room at midnight. Besides that she had to pay for her trip twice.

Wearily after a night out on the town at Leningrad and only a few winks in a chair in the Kremlin lobby, she returned to Moscow late Wednesday and refused to allow Soviet officials to hush up her misadventures.

Soviet Union film officials met the actress at the airport and spent an hour with her at her hotel.

Her secretary, Loretta Lee, told reporters: "They don't want to say anything about what happened in Leningrad."

But Miss MacLaine said: "Facts are facts and are difficult to deny when they are seen."

In making her threat to dance the can-can in front of the Kremlin, the 28-year-old star doubtless had in mind the comment of Premier Khrushchev when he saw her filming Can-Can during his visit to the United States in 1959. He said it was immoral and that she was shocked.
