

A. P. E. C. And Possibilities In Atlantic Provinces Discussed

Dr. Frank MacKinnon, vice president of the Atlantic Provinces economic Council addressed a cross section of business men from many centres in Southern Kings County at a dinner meeting held last night at the Bison Restaurant in Montague.

Mr. Gilbert Clements, a member of the Junior Board of Trade, introduced Dr. MacKinnon, who outlined A. P. E. C. saying that it was an organization of business and professional men in all four Atlantic Provinces who are interested in giving time and help for the betterment of the Atlantic Provinces. He spoke of its functions, first making reference to Maritime possibilities, character and tradition, stating that the Maritimes had much to offer as a centre for general public realized and that the facts should be studied. He said a positive rather than a negative approach should be taken to the economic possibilities. He felt that APEC would be successful, with the planning and cooperation of the four Atlantic Provinces as well as individual support.

A number of committees consisting of agriculture, trade and power as well as committees to study and discuss the economy of P.E.I. Also that APEC was ready to exchange information and anyone who was interested was free to request it.

Mayor Bruce Yeo welcomed all those present and said that to finish one must start and with the interest shown by those in attendance APEC was off to an excellent start in this area.

Mr. John Trevelock introduced Mr. Alan Holman, who expressed appreciation at the large attendance from various centres, and said that APEC could be the salvation of the economy of the Maritimes but that it needed interested membership and support and the more members the more successful it would be.

Sees Submarine Menace To Nfld.

OTTAWA (CP)—Laird Leonsard T. Stuck said Thursday should be taken at once to offset the submarine menace to Newfoundland and Britain if war should come.

Speaking in a Commons defence debate, the MP for Trinity-Clifton, Nfld., said Russia's submarine fleet is the biggest any country has ever had in peacetime. Many submarines, he said, could definitely be sent to Newfoundland and Britain if war should come.

Should a war come, Mr. Stuck said, Newfoundland and Britain could swiftly be cut off from ocean supply lines. Then they would have to depend on air transport.

But Canada hadn't sufficient air transport to handle such a job, it should have enough.

It was high time that the military command became less indecisive and told the nation where it stands on defence.

Red Cross Disaster Group Meeting Is Held At Montague

The annual meeting of the Red Cross Disaster Group was held in the Legion Hall, Montague, Mr. Gordon McDonald, president of Disaster Relief for P.E.I., and Miss Iphigene Arsenault, Red Cross Commissioner, were in attendance.

Judge J. S. DesRoches presided at the meeting and reported that there had been no major disaster in this area during the year. Several fires had been investigated but no help had been required from the Red Cross.

Reports of the various committees were given. The clothing committee reported that the Women's Institutes in the surrounding area had donated various articles of clothing for children up to twelve years of age. These, together with the reserve from the Red Cross, are stored on the basement of the Nurses Home.

It was decided that the next meeting be held in the late spring and if necessary another meeting could be held in the fall.

Mr. Gordon McDonald reported on the work of the disaster group and especially on the lessons learned from the disaster at Springfield, which especially proved the need of definite disaster headquarters in the communities. He also urged that disaster group committees be enlarged so that they would be ready for action at all times. Mr. McDonald said that special emphasis this year is being placed on the home safety program. Mrs. Cudmore has been spearheading this campaign.

Judge J. S. DesRoches then thanked the visitors and the workers of the various committees for their support. Also the chairman, A. F. Campbell, for his help.
