Mail Carrier Service For New City Streets

Hon. John R. Nicholson, Postmaster General has announced that 152 points of call for letter carrier services in the north-west section of Charlottetown have been approved.

Charlottetown postmaster William Griffith said last night, the service would begin as soon as the people were notified of the service and installed mail receptacles in their doors and numbered the houses, approximately within a week, he estimated.

Mr. Griffith said that unfortunately there would be no increase of carrier personnel as the 152 points were spread over a wide area.

In addition, group mail box service by Letter Carrier will be provided to 23 families on Inverman Lane Extension, Belvedere Avenue and Laurie Lane Trailer Park.

This improved postal service will commence when 80 per cent of the patrons who are to receive door-to-door delivery service have installed proper mail receptacles. Forms will be distributed to the patrons com-

ing informing them of the impending service and of the need to install mail receiving facilities.

The streets are: Prince Charles Drive, Newland Crescent, Admiral Street, MacKay Drive, Harbor Lane, Parkview Drive, Charlotte Drive, Dennis Crescent, Edinburgh Drive, Leopold Street, Landsdowne Avenue, Laurie Lane, Johnson Avenue, Riverside Drive, Inverman Lane, Kensington Road, Woodwood Crescent, Duncan Heights, Orchard Court, Maple Avenue, Spring Park Road, Sherwood Crescent, Riverview Drive, Elm Avenue and North River Road.

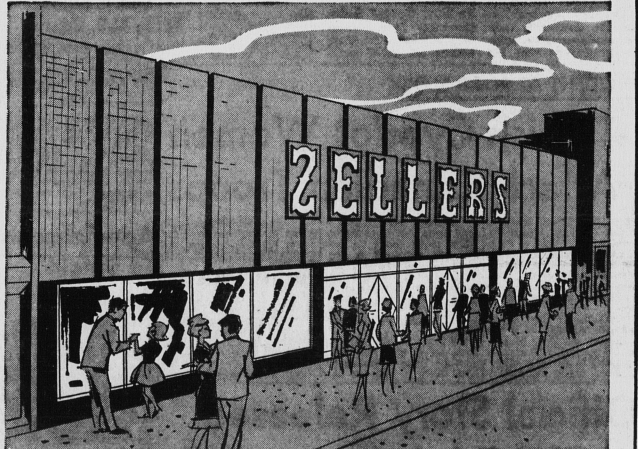
