WILHELMINA IS HAUGHTY.
Wants to let People Know She is Queen

INCIDENTS RELATED AS EVIDENCE OF HER MAJESTY'S SELF-WILL.

AMSTERDAM, Sept. 14.—With the enthronement festivities well nigh over, Queen Wilhelmina is prepared to assume the responsibilities of royalty, which she realizes to the fullest extent. The Queen values her high position, and stories told of her self-will are evidently not exaggerated. The proclamation in the Church originally began, as written by the Prime Minister, "To the people of the Netherlands," but the Queen altered the phrase so as to read, "To my people."

During the special performance at the Royal theatre, when the Queen and the entire house were standing during the chorus, the Queen's song book happened to be lying on the rail before her. With a sharp nudge of her elbow, she prompted the Queen mother, who was standing by her side, to stoop, open the book, and hand it to her haughty young Majesty.

Her love of effect is evinced by the fact that a new window in honour of the House of Orange was placed in the church where the coronation occurred, and especially for the occasion, and the Queen arranged that the ceremony should be so timed that the sunlight, streaming through, should fall full upon her.

For the sake of the poor drunkard himself, and the wives, mothers and children of drunkards, cast you ballot for prohibition on the day appointed, and you will be partakers with all which is humane, good, and Christ like.

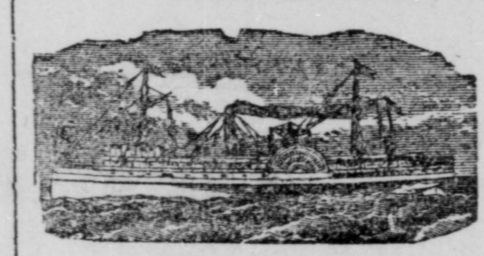
British Navy Salutes.
