Eating And Emotions

By Dr. Theodore R. Van Dellen... Eating when worried or upset is an insult to the digestive system. The stomach is unprepared to receive food and the valves that open and close the entrance to and exit from the gastric pouch are tense and irritable...

When the emotional system is on an even keel, the flow of saliva and other digestive juices is stimulated so that when food reaches the stomach it is ready for digestion...

Chicago's Negro Problem

By Boris Miskow, Canadian Press Staff Writer... Negroes will have to direct their energy from wasteful riots to more constructive enterprises if they hope to resolve the growing racial problems that engulf the urban centres of the United States...

The energy that can touch off an ugly rash of rioting in such centres as Chicago, New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco and elsewhere must be diverted toward the fulfillment of educational needs to raise the Negro from the slums and give him some sort of dignity.

And the feeble excuse by Martin Luther King, a civil rights leader and Nobel Peace Prize winner, that the latest outbreak of racial riots in Chicago resulted from a lack of swimming pools holds little water. The problem is much bigger.

OTEN UNEDUCATED... Negroes from the Southern states have been pouring into Chicago since the Second World War. Often uneducated and untrained, they were motivated by a desire to find opportunities and a life free of racial restrictions...

But swimming pools alone will not solve the problem which has grown large in the face of the turbulent undercurrent of hatred and despair. Fresh riots can be set off anytime at the slightest provocation.
