

# Vessey Takes Big Match's Barwise Cops Aggregate

Firing under extremely adverse light condition the young sharpshooting miss from York, Lorna Vessey, captured top honors in the premiere event of the three-day prize meet of the P.E.I. Rifle Association which concluded Saturday evening at Squaw Point ranges.

To win this event, the Jones Memorial Match, Miss Vessey was forced into a shootout with Capt. Roy McCabe of Charlottetown when both completed the regular match with scores of 166 out of 175 points. In the five round shootout she edged out her opponent by a one point margin scoring 24 out of 25 against McCabe's 23.

Throughout the years shoot-offs have been a common situation but on the first match of the day, the Batt and MacRae event, a situation arose for the first time since competitions resumed after World War Two, when 12 marksmen each registered 48 out of 50 and were forced to fight it out for first place.

At the conclusion of the shoot-off WO1 George Lawrence of Sackville, N.B. was declared the winner after being the only marksman of the dozen to register a perfect 25.

In the Ottawa Aggregate which includes the total of all events fired during the three days and is limited to Island residents only, top honors went to Tpr. Bob Barwise, with a total of 683 out of a possible 725 points. Runner-up to Barwise was WO 2 Mike Susick of CFB Summerside with 677.

Barwise also captured the top spot in the All-comers Aggregate, when he registered a total of 522 points of a possible 550. Once again Susick was the runner-up with 515 points.

In the Barwise Team match in which six four-man teams took part, the No. 3 team comprising: Gnr. Joe Davis, Sgt. George MacLennan, Tpr. Fred White, P-Sgt. John Hanlan and coached by Lt. Mary MacLennan, took first place money, and silverware with a total of 183 of 600 yards of a possible 200.

The annual meet was finally closed out with a banquet and prize presentation at the Basile Recreation Centre at which feature guests were Lieut. Gov. and Mrs. W.J. MacDonald, Councilor John Morris, representing

the City, Leo Doyle representing the Charlottetown Branch, Roy M. Canadian Legion, Cpl. A.M. Hughes the N.B. Rifle Association and Lt. Gordon Higgins, the N.S. Rifle Association.

During the proceedings a presentation was made to Lt. Al Mutch, the retiring president, who this week moves to Kentville, N.S. to take up residence. The remainder of his term as president is being completed by Tpr. Eldon MacLennan, the vice president.
