School Boys Face Charges

SUMMERSIDE — Two Summerside high school boys appeared before Magistrate R. H. Hinton in police court yesterday charged with stealing hats from Summerside.

One pleaded guilty and was given a one year suspended sentence while the other case was adjourned until this evening as the father of the accused was unable to be present.

The father of the 16-year old who pleaded guilty was also ordered to enter into a \$100 bond.

Both boys are sons of airman. Chief of Police S.D.A. Wamsnaker told the court he had received complaints from various businesses that groups of school pupils from St. Ann's Park and Hillcrest enter their stores during noon hour and after school. While one engages the clerk in conversation, the Chief added, the others "fill their pockets."

Spud Shipments Are Fewer So Far

Potato shipments from the province up to Nov. 16 totalled 1,549 carloads, compared to 1,780 carloads for the same period last year, according to Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae.

He said that New Brunswick has more than doubled its shipments up to Nov. 16 this year over last year. This year 3,772 carloads were shipped, compared to 1,532 last year.

"Most of the New Brunswick potatoes are being shipped to South American markets," Mr. MacRae said, "which still helps our market possibilities as it uses up the New Brunswick crop."

Driver Fined \$125 At S'ide

SUMMERSIDE — Michael Jadis of Lennox Island was fined \$125 and costs or 10 days in jail after pleading guilty yesterday in police court to a charge of driving a motor vehicle while his ability was impaired by alcohol or a drug.

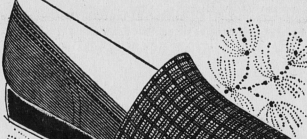
