CARGO BEING LOADED

Loading of the M/V Blue Prince was well under way last night and it is expected that all cargo will be aboard by about noon today. The mixed cargo, consisting of butter, eggs, dressed meats etc., will fill the refrigeration department to capacity, while the hold is decked in the vicinity of 600 young pigs; the whole shipment being a "full cargo." The major portion of the shipments are consigned to St. John's, Nfld., with the balance destined to St. Pierre, Miq., the port of call enroute.

IN PORT

A Naval "crash" HSC 206, arrived in port here late yesterday afternoon for an overnight stop en route from Shearwater, N. S., to Chatham, N. B. She is expected to leave early this morning. In command is a native Islander, Lieut. Channing Gillis, formerly of Point Prim. When the crash boats were manned by R. C. A. F. personnel they were given various Indian names of Canada, but it was found that occasionally the names conflicted with those of R.C.N. destroyers such as the Mimac. For this reason the names were eliminated and the letters and number designations used. The HSC stands for High Speed Launch.
