The Robbery Case.

Preliminary Examination—Stipendiary Magistrate's Courtroom Densely Packed.

Few occurrences have created such a deep and strong feeling, in Charlottetown as the arrest on Saturday, of Mr. Henry Blatch, Chief Clerk of the County Court of Queen's County, for the robbery of the safe in Carvell Bros., Counting room.

Mr. Blatch occupies a responsible position. In connection with his office, he is well and favorably known to the business community; and is related, more or less directly, to many highly respected families.

The preliminary examination was, this forenoon, held before His Honor the Stipendiary Magistrate. The Courtroom was packed with spectators. Malcolm McLeod, Q. C., appeared for the prosecution; and L. H. Davies, Q. C., for the prisoner.

W. H. ATKES, (Sworn)—Am a member of the firm of Carvell Bros. The parties are J. S. Carvell and myself. Missed the money on Friday morning the 15th of Sept. Got to sleep about 8 a. m. Did not at first notice anything wrong. I opened the safe. Two drawers in safe. Found top one had been broken open.
