

Queen Victoria's Kindness.

The Queen's thoughtfulness was pleasantly shown when in '42 she was shot at by Francis. It was Mistress Georgiana's turn to go out driving with her Majesty, and the young woman was not too well pleased when, after waiting several hours, she saw the Queen go off in an open carriage with Prince Albert. That evening "Georgy" first heard of the attempt on her mistress' life and was much affected when the Queen said to her kindly:—"I dare say, Georgy, you were surprised at not driving with me this afternoon; but the fact was that, as we returned from church yesterday, a man presented a pistol at the carriage window, which flashed in the pan. We were so taken by surprise that he had time to escape. So I knew what was hanging over me, and was determined to expose no life but my own."

A comparison of the wealth of Great Britain and the United States has recently been made by Mr. Mulhall well-known as a capable and painstaking English statistician. He estimates the total wealth of the United States at \$49,770,000,000, and that of Great Britain at \$40,840,000,000. This, however, includes the lands of both countries, deducting which leaves the United States with \$42,000,000,000 of "wealth proper" against \$38,940,000,000 for England. The increase of wealth in the United States during the last decade has been at the rate of 23 per cent.

A new method of reducing corn to meal is now in operation at the West, which, it is said, seems likely to supersede the old-fashioned millstones. The corn passes over a series of cylinders provided with fine steel points, revolving rapidly against fixed knives, each set finer than the one preceding. The meal produced is exceedingly fine, there is claimed a saving of fifty per cent, of power, and the machinery is said to be less expensive than burr-stones.

The S. S. "Austrian" from Liverpool, brought to Halifax on Monday evening about one thousand tons of freight, one hundred and nine passengers, besides two hundred and fifty-nine soldiers for the Halifax garrison. Among the passengers were Lady Galway and family, wife of General Galway, Governor of Bermuda. The "Austrian" brought out two hundred and sixty bags of mail matter, which is the largest for some time past. One birth occurred on the voyage.

Suicides are alarmingly frequent in the Prussian army. Recently a cadet shot himself at Richerfeld; a lieutenant killed himself at a ball at Spandau, and another Prussian officer suicided at Paris. Deaths by duelling are also frequent.

On Thursday the Right Rev. Dr. Grandin, Bishop of St. Albert, North-West Territories, had a long and most satisfactory interview with Sir Hector Langevin respecting the Indian affairs of the diocese.
