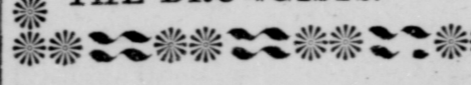

Local and Other Items.

POLICE COURT.—A bicyclist was this morning fined \$2 or 10 days for riding on the sidewalk. One drunk was also disposed of.

THE Steamship Tiber is loading in Montreal for this port and will start Tuesday morning. From here she proceeds to St. John, N. B., via Halifax.

WANT SEWERAGE.—Trio is agitating for a permanent system of sewers. A public meeting is to be called to consider the voting of \$40,000 for that purpose.

LIQUOR REGULATION ACT.—A summons was last evening served on Hugh Hennessey charging an infraction of the law by selling intoxicants in a room not properly fitted up. The summons is returnable on Thursday.

THE LOBSTER TRADE.—Lobster shipments dropped off this week. As compared with last week, there was a decrease of 500 crates. The number shipped by the Halifax yesterday was 630 crates. The slump in the market is responsible for the small export.—Halifax Herald, May 27.

SUPERANNATED.—Capt James Walsh, for many years past keeper of the Summerside light house, has been superannuated, at an allowance of \$114 per annum, and Capt. J. S. Allen has been instructed to take charge of the light house, for the present at least. Capt. Allen went on duty Thursday night.—Agriculturist.

THE HAMIL CASE.—The taking of evidence was concluded in the Hamill murder investigation at Shediac on Thursday. Nothing particularly new was brought out, but there was additional evidence in regard to the finding of blood on the car, and the examination was postponed for eight days. The evidence in the meantime is to be submitted to the Attorney General.

ALWAYS READY.—A Halifax despatch says: While the men who compose the garrison here were at dinner to-day an order came to man the forts at the entrance to the harbor. Each man had to take all that would be required for active services, and a day's ration, tent accommodation for the force, medicine chests and all equipments, amounting to two hundred tons weight, were speedily sent to the water front, where they were loaded on transports and taken to York redoubt and Fort McNab. In two hours fifteen hundred men had manned the forts and not an inkling of the intention to come out had been given.

DOCTOR OF ALCANTARA.—The presentation of this celebrated comic opera on Tuesday evening next promises to be a distinct success.
