Notes and Comments.

—A fishery bureau is to be established at St. John's, N.B., at a cost of \$20,000 per annum.

—The Newfoundland Government proposes to give a subsidy of \$16,000 to the Uluda line for a weekly mail alternating with the Allan steamers.

—The special commissioners sent by the London Lancet to test the water supply of Chicago state in their report that a rumor magnified the faults of the supply. They report that there is every reason to hope that the exhibition will be carried out without an outbreak of an epidemic.

—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Times says: "The Russian Government has proposed a temporary arrangement with Great Britain in the Behring Sea matter, a 10 mile limit off the mainland and 30 miles off the Commander and Robin Islands. The Russian authorities declare that the takings of the captured British sealers comprised 92 per cent. females, 3 per cent. males, and 5 per cent. doubtful. Russia complains that the dispute between Great Britain and the United States has driven all the foreign sealers to the Russian side of the Behring Sea, thus causing a decrease of the Russian company's catch from 30,000 in 1891 to 20,000 in 1892. The negotiations between England and Russia on this question are most friendly. The relations of the two Governments were never more amicable."

—The 123-ton Krupp gun which will soon be on its way to Chicago to be exhibited at the World's Fair, is the largest in the world, and requires a car fifty feet long with thirty-two wheels, which was expressly built for the purpose, for its transportation. The time will come when it will be as antiquated a piece of ordnance as the famous gun known as Mons Meg, which forms one of the curiosities of Edinburgh Castle. Mons Meg was made in the old Flemish town from which it takes its first name, near the close of the 15th century, and was long considered the most formidable piece in the British Isles. But for 200 years it has been as harmless a weapon as it would be if it were a "Quaker gun," having burst during the firing of a salute in honor of the Duke of York, afterward James II., and like Mons Meg, will this Krupp gun be some day, and the world will be no longer depended upon in time of war.

HE WANTED A WIFE.—A man named Alex. Lindsay, who is a widower and lives at Detroit, advertised recently in the Toronto papers for a wife. He said on arriving in Toronto a few days ago that he had received 315 replies. He struck out 300 as being out of the question. His list was reduced to fifteen. He passed through Toronto on a tour of Canada, calling personally on those fifteen, five of whom he said would not do. One was only 15. The others were too old and ugly.

A great political future is predicted for him.

EMIGRANTS COMING.—A late Montreal despatch says: During the last fortnight the C. P. R. has handled two thousand immigrants. During the next three weeks there will be three thousand more coming up from Halifax. That will be five thousand within a month. The C. P. R. agent in England has been doing good work during the past year. The exhibition van, which has been through most of the cities and towns in the old country, filled with big Manitoba potatoes and apples, has a good effect.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

Mechanics Representation.

SIR,—It was a pleasing scene to witness the tribute of respect paid to Hon. Neil Macleod by the Legislature of this Province at the Hotel Davies. Having been a respected member of that body for the past fourteen years, as the representative of the artisans and mechanics of this city who united to elect him to carry out a lien law in their interests which has saved many of them from ruin by unprincipled speculators and builders as well as some real estate owners, he had a strong claim upon the bone and sinew of the people as well as upon the Legislature. That same law, by the present able Master of the Rolls, has been judged as sound and reliable, and his reasons given on the several occasions are based on a sound common sense and justice. But it was painful to see when the toast to the "Artisans" was given that it had to be responded to by two merchants from the country—one from St. John's, the other from Oyster Bed Bridge. The mechanics of Ch'town elected Hon. Neil Macleod as their candidate. He is now Judge Macleod—a fitting honor for his political and legal services to his country. When will the said mechanics be represented in the Legislature by one of their own class? Do you not know in artisans that the present is late enough in the day? Have you not borne the burden and heat of the day long enough without being recognized in the Councils of your country? Have you no man in your ranks with business grasp sufficient to send to the Legislature? Must you always be led by a member of the legal profession or some of the other classes of our city whose sole ambition is to legislate in their own interest, and finally settle down without doing anything to build up your city or increase its interests, whereby labor would be employed and the position of the mechanic and artisan would be improved; whereby a greater home market for our farmers would be provided and the dignity of labor upheld, which is entirely lost sight of—as witness the state of things existing at the Judge Macleod dinner.
