Gifted Scot Made Monument At Brudenell

The monument, which was erected in 1903 to the Scottish pioneers on Brudenell Island, was designed by the late William A. Lewis, sculptor of Cardigan who carried on the monumental business with his late brother David A. Lewis. Mrs. William A. Lewis is surviving as is most of the family.

This business was founded by the late William Patterson Lewis of Dumfries and Edinburgh, Scotland when he emigrated with his bride Agnes Smith to this country.

The Lewis Brothers William A. and David A. were sons of the above mentioned W. P. Lewis. One of the wonderful works of art testifying to this Scot's talent is the main altar in the All Saints Roman Catholic Church, Cardigan which was designed and carved by the senior Mr. Lewis.

The only surviving member of this gifted Lewis family of ten children is Mrs. William M. Flynn, Richmond St. Charlottetown.

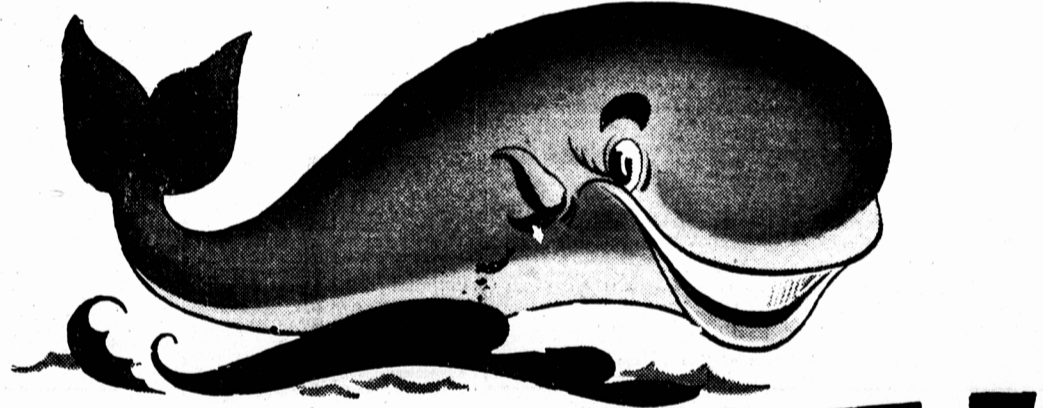
