ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL.—A handsome carved oak reredos is being placed in position in St. Peter's Cathedral this week and will be completed by next Sunday. The gift is erected as a memorial to the late Miss Rosa M. Stewart, who was a member of the church.

MILITIA ADVANCES.—Addressing the 62nd Fusiliers at St. John, Hon. Dr. Borden said: He put forward three requirements of the militia man. The first was that he must be a man of brains capable to care for himself independently and yet under his officer's orders. Militia work has been looked on by some as a huge picnic, but he said it was business, as the sending of a tenth of the militia force to South Africa showed, and he proposed that it should be business.

A second was that the militia must have mobility. His idea was to have horses for the infantry of Canada and he proposed as far as possible to make the infantry mounted infantry so that they could move rapidly from point to point.

Thirdly, the militia man should be an expert rifle man, and, with the new range, it would be the local men's fault if they did not make themselves expert with the fine arms provided them.

DROWNING.—While Wilbert Arseneault, son of Mr. Frank Arseneault, Summerside, and Wesley Allen, son of Mr. B. C. Allen, Muddy Creek, were returning from their lobster traps off Fifteen Point about 1 p. m., last Thursday a squall struck and capsized their boat. Both clung to the mast, which was out of the water. Arseneault became exhausted, and then Allen held him in his arms for a long time, some say an hour and a half, but he died from exhaustion and cold. Allen still held Arseneault in his arms for half an hour after he died, but finally was forced to let him go. About 5 p. m. Allen was rescued, after being four hours in the water, in such a thoroughly exhausted and chilled condition that he could not have held on much longer. Other boats were about at the time, but no one seems to have seen the accident in time. It was noticed at last by a passing boat. Arseneault was twenty-three and was married a few months ago.
