**Nurses Shown "Casualties" In Atomic Blast**

ARNPRIOR, Ont. (CP)—Leading Canadian nurses witnessed lifelike demonstrations Wednesday of the grisly after effects of an atomic explosion.

The nurses, directors and instructors from nursing schools across Canada, are attending a course at the Civil Defence College here.

The demonstration, staged by members of the civil defence here, was designed to show the nurses what they could expect under actual disaster conditions.

The "casualties" were made up by C.D. experts to look like injured persons.

**SYNTHETIC BLOOD**  
 Plasticine burns and swollen tissues were applied over their grease paint pallor. Compound fractures were produced with pieces of animal bone, and synthetic blood dripped from their wounds.

The demonstration was held at the college's outdoor "rescue wing"—an extensive pile of rubble and half-destroyed walls.

An emergency first aid station was set up where stretchers bearers brought the "wounded" for initial treatment and evacuation to "hospitals."

Earlier, the nurses were told that a disaster would present considerable public health problems in addition to the care of the injured.

**WOULD FACE SHORTAGES**  
 Water supplies and sewage disposal might be cut off with grave danger to health. If the populations of large cities were evacuated to surrounding towns, the health facilities of the smaller centres would be overburdened.

There would be a shortage of doctors and nurses and some might be killed in the attack. Hospital space would be inadequate to care for the sick and wounded, especially since a considerable proportion of it would be bombed out.

The program of stockpiling medical supplies was outlined. For some years dressings, antibiotics and surgical instruments have been stockpiled at undisclosed locations near several important target areas.

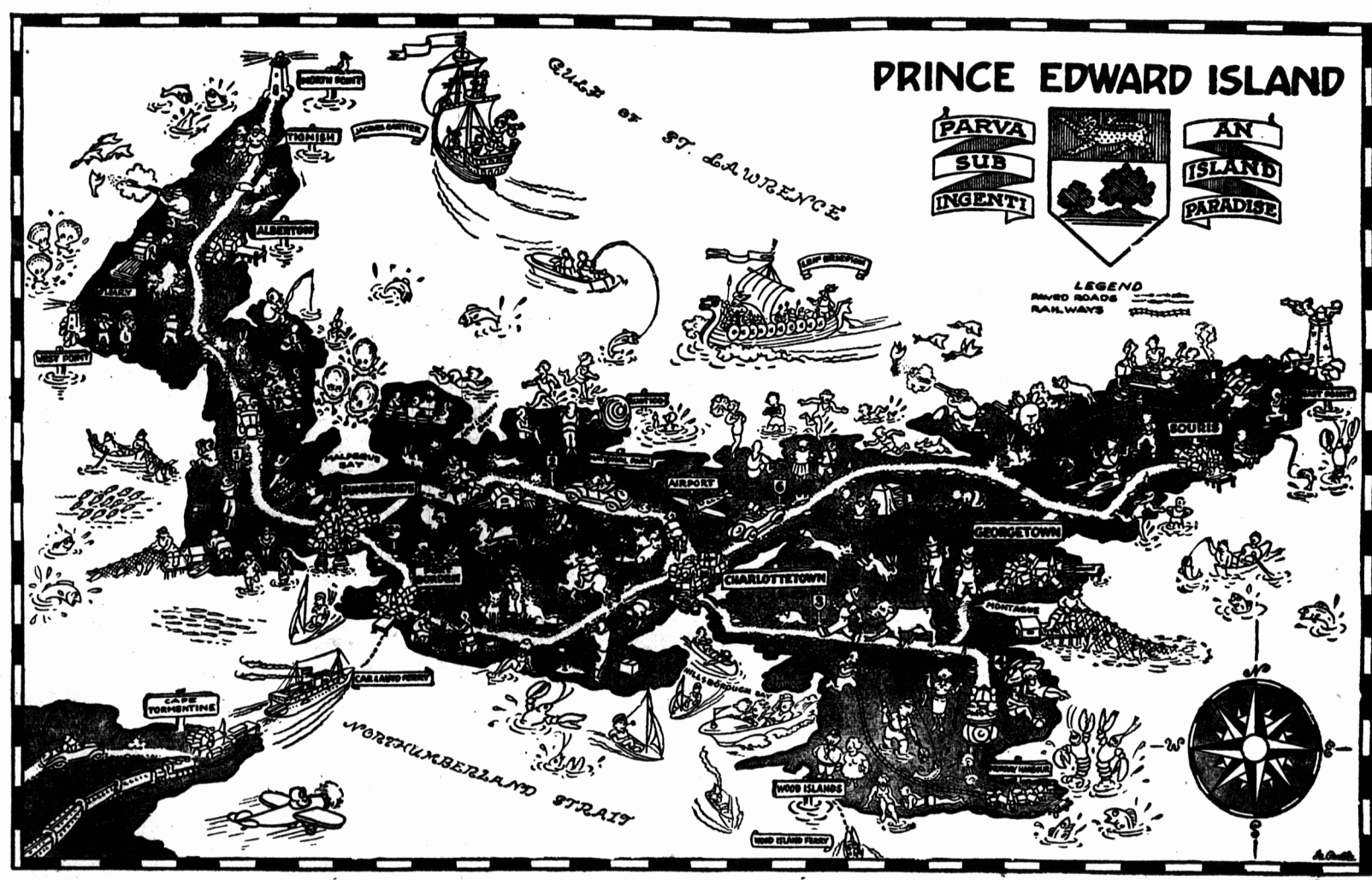
