

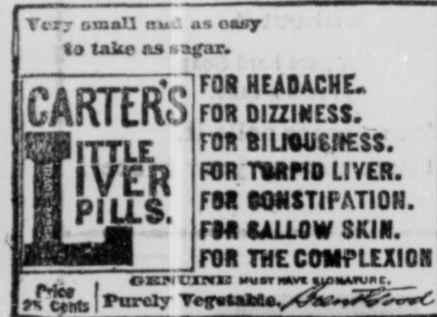

LETTER FROM SOUTH AFRICA.

Private Leslie's Interesting Letter to His Father.

Mr. William Leslie has received the following letter from his son, Joshua. It is dated Paardeberg, March 4th:

I am in fairly good health, barring a slight cold. We marched here from Graspan Station mostly at night, and started to outflank the enemy at Magerfontein; but Cronje had fled and we started in the direction of his capital, Bloemfontein. We then changed directions to intercept him which we did on Sunday, and our regiment, with the Gordons, Cornwall's and Shropshire, engaged them all day. We lost 96 killed and wounded. The Boers were strongly entrenched and we could not get in on them with the bayonet. Their rifle fire was awful. They retired during the night further up the river. We were again under fire on Tuesday at 1,000 yards and lost 4 killed and wounded. Then we occupied kopjes all around them to cut off their retreat. At 2 o'clock on Tuesday morning the Gordons, Cornwall's and ourselves started to advance our trenches. We were on the right and got within about 25 yards of their position, when they opened a regular storm of bullets on us. The fire appeared to come from under our feet. We fell back about 20 yards and with the help of the Engineers entrenched ourselves. So when daylight broke the Boers found the Canadians rather near for comfort. Those nearest us ceased firing and put up the white flag; but it was not minded until we were informed that Cronje himself had gone to Roberts under a flag of truce. Our fire then ceased and the Boers began coming over to our trenches. During all this the Gordons or Cornwall's had not left the main trench. The Island boys were all in the thick of it, and stayed right at it, too. It is only a miracle that we were not all killed; but as we stuck to the shovel and did not fire until we got our trench dug they could not get our range in the darkness, and their shots went high, although "F" "G" and "H" companies lost heavily at the first fire. Neither McCarthy nor Mellish got a scratch, although men fell all around us.

ANTI-CIGARETTES LEAGUE.

An Important Movement.

The ladies of the W. C. T. U. of this city, are, we learn, taking steps towards the formation of an Anti-Cigarette League. The plan, as explained in the Union Signal, is to organize Anti-Cigarette Leagues in all schools where boys are taught. After consultation with their parents they are asked to sign the following pledge:

We, the undersigned pupils, do hereby pledge ourselves upon honor:

1. From this date to abstain from smoking cigarettes in any form until we reach the age of twenty-one years.

2. To use all influence that we possess to induce all public school boys of our acquaintance to give up and abstain from smoking cigarettes until such boys shall have attained the age of twenty-one years.

3. By giving the pledge hereby made and by signing our names to the above, we constitute ourselves members of the Anti-Cigarette Smoking League, No.—of the city of—

The constitution declares that the object of the association "shall be the suppression of the cigarette smoking habit among the public school boys and other boys by personal example and other means."

The following provisions are made for the organization of a league and the discipline of its members.

The officers of the association shall be a president, vice-president and secretary. There also shall be a council of ten members, all of whom shall be pupils attending the said school.

The officers of the association shall be elected annually by ballot on the first Friday after the opening of the schools in September of each year.

The council shall consist of the ten boys, members of the league, who receive the largest number of votes cast by the pupils of the school at the annual election.

Every member of the league shall be entitled to wear the button or insignia designating membership so long as he maintains good faith and keeps his agreement to abstain from smoking cigarettes.

If any member violates his agreement and is reported to the council, upon proof that there has been such violation the name of such offender shall be dropped from the roll and he shall be required to surrender his button to the council.

Any member who has been dropped shall, after six months, upon proof that is satisfactory to the council, that he has not during such period smoked cigarettes, be reinstated in membership, and have his decoration restored to him.

Any member found guilty of a second offence by the council shall no longer be eligible to membership while a member of the school.

The decoration or badge shall become the property of the wearer unless deprived of it by act of the council as heretofore prescribed.

Elections and meetings shall not be held during school hours, and the principal of the school shall be present at all such meetings. A meeting of the league shall be held on the first Friday of every month of the school every year.

HOW TO BRUSH A HAT.

An Expert Gives a Hint Which Should be Valuable.

Some men will buy two or three black derby hats a season, and these will always look rusty and old. Other men will buy not more than one a year, and that will never lose its deep and brilliant gloss.

"I'll tell you why it is," said one who has long been considered an expert on questions of dress. "It is because one man brushes his hat with a stiff bristle whisk and the other rubs his softly with a piece of woolen cloth. The felt of a hat is such a delicate stuff that a stiff whisk applied to it has pretty much the effect of that a currycomb or a rake would have on a suit of clothes. It wears the nap off, exposing the bear grey in short order. A piece of woolen cloth, rubbed over a hat with a circular motion that conforms to the grain, doesn't rub off the nap at all, but keeps it lustrous and firm and of good colour. I buy one two-and-a-half hat a year, and rub it each morning with a bit of flannel. I guarantee that it outlasts three \$5 hats that are raked and scraped with whisks every day."
