

Auto Companies Cool On Gov't Parts Plan

TORONTO (CP)—The presidents of Canadian automobile companies say they are not interested in taking over the auto parts manufacturing industry as a result of Canada's new auto policy.

The policy announced by Industry Minister Drury last week will allow automobile manufacturers to qualify for rebates on duties paid for imports to the extent, they, or the parts manufacturer, increase exports.

Since there is slight possibility of manufacturers increasing exports of finished vehicles, the greatest export potential is in the parts industry, now dominated by independent Canadian companies.

F. H. Walker, president of General Motors of Canada Limited, said the suggestion that the automobile companies are interested in a take-over is "ridiculous."

Earl K. Brownridge, president of American Motors (Canada) Limited, said there is no reason to take over parts plants since they get rebates on duties for all sales they arrange.

Ron W. Toddlam, president of Chrysler Canada Limited, dismissed as "conjecture" any suggestion that the new auto policy would lead to greater U.S. take-over. "Nothing but good can come from the new legislation," he said.

George East, Canadian director of the United Auto Workers Union, said he is more concerned with the possible dislocation of workers as a result of the new policy. He said a manufacturer might switch his product or plant to compete for the export markets.
