More Than 4 Tons Lobsters Served During Big Carnival

More than four tons of lobsters were served at the four-day Summerside Lobster Carnival which concluded on Saturday after thousands of persons had enjoyed daily programs of entertainment and delicious lobster suppers.

A highlight of Saturday's events was the crowning of pretty Patricia Preston, as Sea Queen of the carnival, and the presentation of prizes to the Queen and lovely Princesses Lill Mueller, Edith MacEwen and George Lockhart.

The afternoon program attracted hundreds of persons who crowded on to the Marine Wharf and the Holman's Wharf to watch boat races and an Air Force and Navy air-and-sea show which preceded a parade of winners in the various events of the four-day carnival.

The parade route led from Holman's Wharf to the Civic Stadium for the final lobster supper enjoyed by 1,500 persons.

Following the supper came the official crowning of the Sea Queen and the evening program included horse racing prior to the conclusion of the carnival with a colorful display of fireworks shortly before midnight.

Excellent weather prevailed during the four-day carnival which had warm sunny days throughout, and not a single event on the whole program had to be cancelled due to weather conditions.

Crowds of tourists as well as hundreds of Island residents attended the carnival and although heavy traffic was almost continuous, the excellent work of traffic control done by the Summerside Police Department and members of the Summerside Fire Department, there was not a single injury or serious accident.

During the carnival, members of the Fire Department worked with and assisted the police in the work of traffic control.

At Civic Stadium one-half of the building was used as a dining hall, while the remainder was used for industrial displays and entertainment.

In a statement last evening the carnival director Charles Hogan, said the carnival had been a tremendous success, and had fulfilled one of its purposes in attracting large numbers of tourists to Prince Edward Island and to Summerside.

He said the experience gained by this, the first annual lobster carnival, would be invaluable in planning the program for next year.

Mr. Hogan was appreciative of the splendid response of the tourists, and of the co-operation and wholehearted support of business firms, service clubs, organizations, committees, and individuals whose combined efforts made the carnival such an outstanding success.

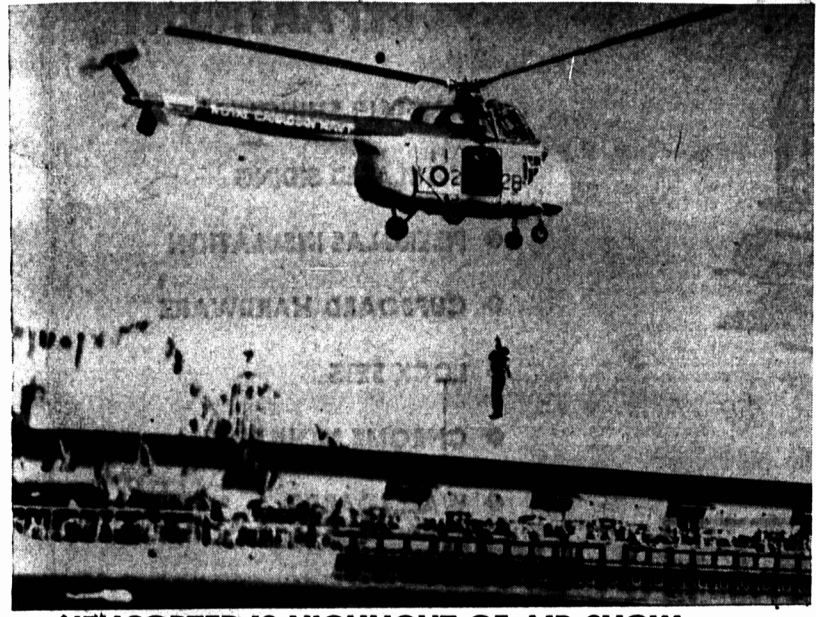
